**Management training opens for senior Liberian Immigration Officers**

*Monrovia, Liberia* - A two-week strategic management workshop for 18 senior officers of Liberia's Bureau of Immigration and Naturalization (BIN) started in Monrovia yesterday.

Jointly organized by UN Police and BIN, the workshop will enhance the skills of prospective and existing senior managers of the Bureau in strategic management and prepare them for leadership and command roles.

Addressing participants at the opening, Acting BIN Commissioner, Cllr. Abia G. Williams, urged them to take the training seriously and be transformed into good ambassadors of Liberia. She then thanked the United Nations Police for organizing the workshop and appealed for more capacity-building opportunities to strengthen the Bureau of Immigration and Naturalization.

United Nations Police Commissioner Mohammed Alhassan called on the participants to rise to the call of duty with professionalism, dignity and respect for their colleagues in a manner that projects the core values of a professional law enforcement officer. He urged them to put into action the knowledge and experience they will acquire from the training to build BIN into a legitimate, modern, democratic law enforcement agency which values human rights and the Rule of Law.

Facilitators at the workshop comprise senior management experts from the University of Liberia and UNMIL senior managers.
