- Background

Pursuant to General Assembly resolution 68/71 of 9 December 2013 on sustainable fisheries, the tenth round of Informal Consultations of States Parties to United Nations Fish Stocks Agreement (UNFSA) will be convened for two days on 7 and 8 April 2014 to consider, inter alia, regional, sub-regional and global implementation of the Agreement and initial preparatory work for the resumption of the Review Conference, which will be resumed at a date not earlier than 2015.

- UN Grounds Passes (Intergovernmental organizations)

Representatives from intergovernmental organizations invited to attend the tenth round of informal consultations should communicate their intention to attend the meeting directly to the Protocol and Liaison Service, copy to the Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea (DOALOS), for issuance of grounds passes, which allow access to United Nations premises where the meetings of the Informal Consultations of States Parties are held. Communications should include the names and contact details of representatives of intergovernmental organizations.

A special form may be downloaded by intergovernmental organizations by following the link to the Protocol and Liaison Service site (http://www.un.int/protocol/) and submitted with the official nomination letter to the Protocol and Liaison Service. Representatives of intergovernmental organizations must pick-up their UN grounds passes directly from the UN Pass Office at 801 United Nations Plaza (45th Street and First Avenue) prior to attending the Informal Consultations of States Parties. An official document identifying the representative should be presented at the time. Representatives of Intergovernmental organizations having a liaison office in New York should endeavour to obtain their UN grounds pass from that office.

- UN Grounds Passes (Non-governmental organizations)

The names and contact details of representatives of non-governmental organizations invited to attend the tenth round of informal consultations of States Parties to UNFSA should be communicated to DOALOS for issuance of grounds passes, as necessary to allow access to United Nations premises where the meetings of the Informal Consultations of States Parties are held.

DOALOS will communicate directly to the non-governmental organization representatives the venue, date and time for pick-up of their UN grounds pass.
