Review Conference on the Agreement for the Implementation of the Provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982 relating to the Conservation and Management of Straddling Fish Stocks and Highly Migratory Fish Stocks

New York, 24-28 May 2010

# Information for participants (revised 19 April 2010)

1. The General Assembly, in its resolution 63/112 of 5 December 2008, requested the Secretary-General to resume the Review Conference for one week in the first part of 2010, with a view to assessing the effectiveness of the Agreement in securing the conservation and management of straddling fish stocks and highly migratory fish stocks. Pursuant to General Assembly resolution 64/72 of 4 December 2009, the resumed Review Conference will be held on 24-28 May 2010 in New York.

#### **Documents**

- 2. General Assembly resolution 63/112 also requested the Secretary-General to submit to the resumed Review Conference an updated comprehensive report, prepared in cooperation with the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), to assist the Conference in discharging its mandate under article 36, paragraph 2, of the Agreement. The updated comprehensive report of the Secretary-General (A/CONF.210/2010/1) is available on the website of DOALOS.
- 3. The Conference will consider and adopt an agenda and an organization of work based on recommendations of the ninth round of Informal Consultations of States Parties to the United Nations Fish Stocks Agreement. The provisional agenda and draft organization of work of the resumed Review Conference are available on the website of DOALOS as documents A/CONF.210/2010/L.1 and A/CONF.210/2010/L.2, respectively.
- 4. The Secretariat has prepared a compilation to assist delegations in considering the report of the Secretary-General to the resumed Review Conference. The compilation (A/CONF.210/2010/INF.1) presents the recommendations adopted at the Review Conference in 2006 (A/CONF.210/2006/15, Annex), in thematic form, with the corresponding information from States, regional fisheries management organizations and arrangements, and the FAO, as contained in the report of the Secretary-General, on the extent to which the recommendations have been implemented. An advance and unedited (English only) version of the compilation is available on the website of DOALOS. The document will be available in all official languages at the Conference.

### **Composition of the Bureau**

6. The President of the Conference is engaging in consultations to confirm the availability of the members of the Bureau. Should any Officer be unavailable to perform his or her functions, an election will be held to fill the vacancy.

- 7. In accordance with article 36 of the Agreement, invitations to participate in the resumed Review Conference have been addressed to all States Parties to the Agreement and those States and entities which are entitled to become parties, as well as those intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations entitled to participate as observers.
- 8. Non-governmental organizations invited to attend the resumed Review Conference must have consultative status with the Economic and Social Council, or be accredited to the Commission on Sustainable Development or associated with the Department of Public Information.
