



Regular process for global reporting and assessment of the state of the marine environment, including socio-economic aspects

Group of Experts established pursuant to General Assembly resolution 65/37

1. In paragraph 209 of resolution 65/37 of 7 December 2010, the General Assembly decided to establish a group of experts to be an integral part of the Regular Process for global reporting and assessment of the state of the marine environment, including socio-economic aspects (the “Regular Process”). It requested the members of the Group of Experts, appointed by Member States pursuant to paragraph 180 of General Assembly resolution 64/71 of 4 December 2009, to continue serving on the Group of Experts for the duration of the first phase of the first assessment cycle, and encouraged regional groups that had not yet done so to appoint experts to the Group of Experts in accordance with paragraph 180 of resolution 64/71.
