Twenty-seventh meeting

<u>Information for participants</u>

The twenty-seventh meeting of States Parties to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea will be held in New York from 12 to 16 June 2017 (see paragraph 54 of <u>General Assembly resolution 71/257 of 23 December 2016</u>).

Officers of the Meeting

In accordance with Rule 19 (Election of officers) of the Rules of Procedure for Meetings of States Parties (<u>SPLOS/2/Rev.4</u>), "[t]he Meeting of States Parties shall elect from among the representatives of States Parties participating in the Meeting the following officers: a President and four Vice-Presidents, one from each region, excluding the region of the President...".

Provisional agenda and other documents

The provisional agenda for the twenty-seventh meeting is contained in document SPLOS/L.78. Credentials

Credentials of representatives of States Parties should be transmitted to the Secretariat (Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea, Office of Legal Affairs, Room DC2-0450, United Nations, New York, NY 10017) as soon as possible and *no later* than twenty-four hours after the opening of the Meeting on *Monday*, *12 June 2017*, signed by the Head of State or Government or the Minister for Foreign Affairs or any person authorized by either of them (rule 13 (2) of the Rules of Procedure for Meetings of States Parties (SPLOS/2/Rev.4).

In conformity with the understanding reached by the twenty-third Meeting of States Parties (see <u>SPLOS/263</u>, paragraph 101), credentials should cover the period from 20 to 24 June 2016 and, to the extent

practicable, also thereafter until the convening of the twenty-eighth Meeting of States Parties.

Timely submission of credentials is essential to ensure the efficient conduct of the election of seven members of the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea and the election of twenty-one members of the Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf.

Observers

Observers are invited to transmit to the Secretariat (Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea, Office of Legal Affairs, Room DC2-0450, United Nations, New York, NY 10017) the names of the representatives who will form part of their delegation, as soon as possible.

Papersmart

PaperSmart arrangements will be available for the duration of the twenty-seventh Meeting of States Parties. Delegations wishing to circulate their statements electronically through the PaperSmart portal should send a copy of the statement at least one hour in advance of delivery to papersmart5@un.org. The entity name, date of the meeting and the agenda item should be indicated in the heading of the statement and in the subject line of the e-mail. The statements will be made available on the PaperSmart portal after their delivery by delegations. PDF format is preferred. Delegations are kindly requested to provide twenty hardcopies of the text for the technical services no later than one hour before delivery of the statement.

UN Grounds Passes for Intergovernmental organizations

Representatives from intergovernmental organizations with a standing invitation to attend the Meeting of States Parties should communicate their intention to attend the meeting directly to the Protocol and Liaison Service (Room S-0201, Fax: +1 212 963-1921 or email: unprotocol@un.org) by **31 May 2017**, with a copy to the Division for Ocean Affairs and the Law of the Sea, Office of Legal Affairs. A template letter for this purpose is provided below. The representatives of intergovernmental organizations having a Liaison Office in New York should endeavour to obtain their United Nations grounds passes through that Office.

Intergovernmental organizations without an office in New York must submit a form SG.6 for each member of the delegation for issuance of grounds passes for temporary meetings, together with an official nomination letter (stamped and singed by the head of the organization) to the Protocol and Liaison Service, by **31 May 2017**. The official letter must also include a name and email address of a focal point to receive the accreditation approval. The SG.6 form can be downloaded from the website of the Protocol and Liaison Service at https://www.un.int/protocol/protocol/forms-and-checklists.

Upon presentation of the accreditation approvals, representatives of intergovernmental organizations must pick-up their United Nations grounds passes directly from the United Nations Pass Office at 320 East 45th Street. An official document with photograph (e.g., passport) identifying the representative must be presented at that time. Representatives without

grounds passes will not be able to access the United Nations Headquarters compound.
