6380th meeting (closed) *Meeting of the Security Council with the troop- and police-contributing countries pursuant to resolution 1353 (2001), annex II, sections A and B*

United Nations Stabilization Mission in Haiti

The Security Council met in private. At the close of the meeting, the following communiqué was issued by the Secretary-General in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Council:

“On 9 September 2010, the Security Council, pursuant to annex II, sections A and B of resolution 1353 (2001), held its 6380th meeting in private with the troop- and police-contributing countries to the United Nations Stabilization Mission in Haiti.

“The Security Council and the troop- and police-contributing countries heard a briefing under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure by Mr. Farid Zarif, Director of the Europe and Latin American Division of the Department of Peacekeeping Operations.

“Members of the Council, Mr. Zarif and representatives of participating troop- and police-contributing countries had an exchange of views.”

6381st meeting *Election of a member of the International Court of Justice (S/2010/442, S/2010/443 and S/2010/444)*

The agenda was adopted without objection.

The delegations of Bosnia and Herzegovina and Lebanon were selected, by the drawing of lots by the President, to serve as tellers.

On the first ballot, Ms. Joan E. Donoghue received the required absolute majority of votes in the Security Council.

The President of the Council read out the text of a letter he had received from the President of the General Assembly, communicating the result of the voting held at the 118th plenary meeting of the General Assembly.

Having received the required absolute majority of votes both in the Security Council and in the General Assembly, Ms. Joan E. Donoghue was elected as a member of the International Court of Justice for a term of office ending 5 February 2015.

The President informed the General Assembly that he had received information about additional submissions from a national group.

The General Assembly decided to adopt the same procedure as practiced at the 44th plenary meeting of its sixtieth session, on 7 November 2005, should more than the required number of candidates obtained an absolute majority of votes on the same ballot.

On the first ballot, one candidate, Ms. Joan E. Donoghue (United States) (159 votes), obtained an absolute majority of votes.

The President of the General Assembly read out a letter he had received from the President of the Security Council, communicating the result of the voting held at the 6381st meeting of the Security Council.

Having obtained an absolute majority of votes in both the General Assembly and the Security Council, Ms. Joan E. Donoghue (United States) was declared elected a member of the International Court of Justice for a term of office commencing 9 September 2010 and ending on 5 February 2015.

The representative of the Islamic Republic of Iran made a statement on a point of order.

The General Assembly thus concluded its consideration of sub-item (c) of agenda item 110.

119th plenary meeting *The situation in the occupied territories of Azerbaijan: draft resolution (A/64/L.57)* [18]

The representative of Azerbaijan made a statement, in the course of which he withdrew draft resolution [A/64/L.57](#).

Multilateral Treaty Framework: An invitation to universal participation

2010 Treaty Event: Towards universal participation and implementation

United Nations Headquarters (21–23 and 27–28 September 2010)

It is recalled that a series of successful treaty events have been held annually at the Headquarters of the United Nations commencing with the Millennium Summit in 2000. This year, the annual treaty event will be held from Tuesday, 21, to Thursday, 23 September, and on Monday, 27, and Tuesday, 28 September 2010, at United Nations Headquarters, to coincide with the general debate of the sixty-fifth session of the General Assembly.

The Event, entitled “2010 Treaty Event: Towards universal participation and implementation”, provides a distinct opportunity for States to demonstrate their continuing commitment to the central role of the rule of law in international relations. This year’s event will highlight treaties of global reach such as human rights, terrorism, penal matters, disarmament, climate change and the protection of United Nations personnel. In particular, this year will highlight a theme which celebrates and safeguards life on earth, biodiversity. 2010 marks the International Year of Biodiversity; it also marks the start of the United Nations Decade for Deserts and the Fight against Desertification, another global issue requiring a global response.

The list of treaties being highlighted this year has been circulated by depositary notification C.N.243.2010.TREATIES-3 of 28 April 2010. As is customary, it will be possible to undertake treaty actions with regard to any treaty deposited with the Secretary-General during the treaty event. Necessary facilities, including media coverage, will be made available for treaty actions to be undertaken in a solemn setting.

Delegations intending to sign or deposit instruments of ratification, acceptance, approval or accession relating to multilateral treaties deposited with the Secretary-General during the treaty event may wish to inform their Governments accordingly for the purpose of completing the requisite domestic procedures.

Under established international practice, only Heads of State, Heads of Government or Ministers for Foreign Affairs are empowered, by virtue of their functions, to sign treaties on behalf of States without having to produce full powers to that effect. All other representatives wishing to sign treaties must be in possession of appropriate full powers, which expressly authorize signature of specified treaties by a named representative issued and signed by one of these authorities. Likewise, instruments of ratification, acceptance, approval or accession must be issued and signed by the same authorities.

The Secretary-General would be obliged if States wishing to sign, ratify or accede to any of the treaties could notify and provide copies of full powers/instruments in advance to the Treaty Section.

International Cocoa Agreement, 2001**Geneva, 25 June 2010****Opening for signature**

In accordance with its article 54, the above Agreement shall be open for signature in New York from 1 October 2010 until 30 September 2012, by parties to the International Cocoa Agreement, 2001, and Governments invited to the United Nations Conference, 2010.

Certified true copies of the Agreement, of which the Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish texts are equally authentic, will be prepared and will be transmitted to all States as soon as possible.

The Secretary-General takes this opportunity to recall that, under established international practice, only Heads of State, Heads of Government or Ministers for Foreign Affairs are empowered by virtue of their functions, to sign a treaty on behalf of a State without having to produce full powers to that effect. Other representatives wishing to sign a treaty must be in possession of appropriate full powers, which expressly authorize signature of a specific treaty by a named representative issued and signed by one of these authorities. Full powers are distinct from credentials. Credentials alone are not adequate for the purpose of signing a treaty.

The Secretary-General would be obliged if States wishing to sign the Agreement could notify, and provide copies of the required full powers in advance to the Treaty Section, Office of Legal Affairs (380 Madison Avenue, New York; e-mail depositaryCN@un.org; tel. 1 (212) 963-5047; fax 1 (212) 963-3693).
