LETTER DATED 30 JULY 1999 FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO RESOLUTION 864 (1993) CONCERNING THE SITUATION IN ANGOLA ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

As Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 864 (1993) concerning the situation in Angola, I have the honour to transmit herewith a list of 10 experts appointed to the expert panels established in accordance with paragraph 6 of Security Council resolution 1237 (1999) of 7 May 1999. The appointment of these experts was approved by the Committee today under the no-objection procedure.

My intention is to convene a meeting of the expert panels in New York at the end of the fourth week of August. I would also propose that, if the members of the Security Council do not object, the submission of the interim report requested in paragraph 7 of resolution 1237 (1999) be delayed until 30 September 1999.

I would be grateful if this letter, together with its enclosure, could be circulated to members of the Security Council for their information and issued as a document of the Security Council.
