**PROCEDURES FOR UPDATING AND MAINTAINING THE LIST OF PERSONS SUBJECT  
TO TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS PURSUANT TO RESOLUTION 1521 (2003)**

1. In accordance with paragraph 21(d) of resolution 1521 (2003), the Committee designated, on 16 March 2004, the individuals who are subject to the measures preventing entry into or transit through the territories of all States as imposed by paragraph 4(a) of the resolution. The initial list of designated individuals was published in the form of a United Nations Press Release as SC/8027, dated 16 March 2004.
2. The list of designated individuals will be maintained on the web page of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1521 (2003) concerning Liberia. Details of the dates of birth, passport numbers and aliases of the persons included on the list shall be provided where such information has been made available to the Committee.
3. The Committee will review the list every three months in connection with outstanding requests to remove individuals from the list received through the Permanent Mission of which the listed individual is a national, or through the nearest UN office. In exceptional cases, the Committee will consider requests received directly from individuals. Consideration will also be given to requests from members for the addition of names to or deletion of names from the list. All requests for the addition of names to or deletion of names from the list should be received not less than 48 hours prior to the commencement of the quarterly review process. The Chair will circulate all requests received to the members. The Chair will also send interim responses to each request for deletion of names from the list pending its consideration by the Committee at the next review.
4. After each quarterly review, Member States will be informed of additions to or deletions from the list through Notes Verbale from the Committee. A Press Release will also be issued containing the complete updated list, including any revisions agreed at the last quarterly review. The Press Release will also provide the URL where the updated list can be found on the Internet. The list will not be reissued if its contents remain unchanged at the conclusion of the quarterly review process.
5. Additional information and/or corrections received from Member States in connection with names already inscribed on the list will be circulated under the no-objection procedure. If no objections are received, the additional information and/or corrections will be immediately incorporated in the Internet-based list. Member States will be informed of additional information and/or corrections through Notes Verbale from the Committee. A Press Release will also be issued containing the complete updated list.
