

NEW ANALYSIS SHOWS 42.3 PERCENT DONOR DISBURSEMENT RATE FOR HAITI RECOVERY

November 23—The United Nations Office of the Special Envoy for Haiti (OSE) has conducted a new analysis of pledges made for post-earthquake recovery activities in Haiti, revealing a 2010 disbursement rate among top donors of 42.3 percent.

The OSE requests regular updates from the top 30 pledge-makers at the March 31 international donors conference, and has received comprehensive data for 24 of them. These 24 donors pledged \$5.75 billion (93 percent) of the \$6.17 billion total for 2010 and 2011. For 2010 alone, the 24 donors pledged approximately \$2.12 billion for recovery activities (excluding debt relief totaling \$1.12 billion). Of the \$2.12 billion, \$897 million (42.3 percent) has been disbursed.

This \$897 million has been disbursed through four channels:

- \$200.3 million in budget support to the Government of Haiti
- \$209.3 million in pooled grant funding to the United Nations, Inter-American Development Bank and the World Bank through the Haiti Reconstruction Fund
- \$359.1 million in grants to the Government of Haiti, multilateral agencies, NGOs and private contractors
- \$128.3 million in loans to the Government of Haiti

This analysis does not include funds pledged for humanitarian relief activities.
