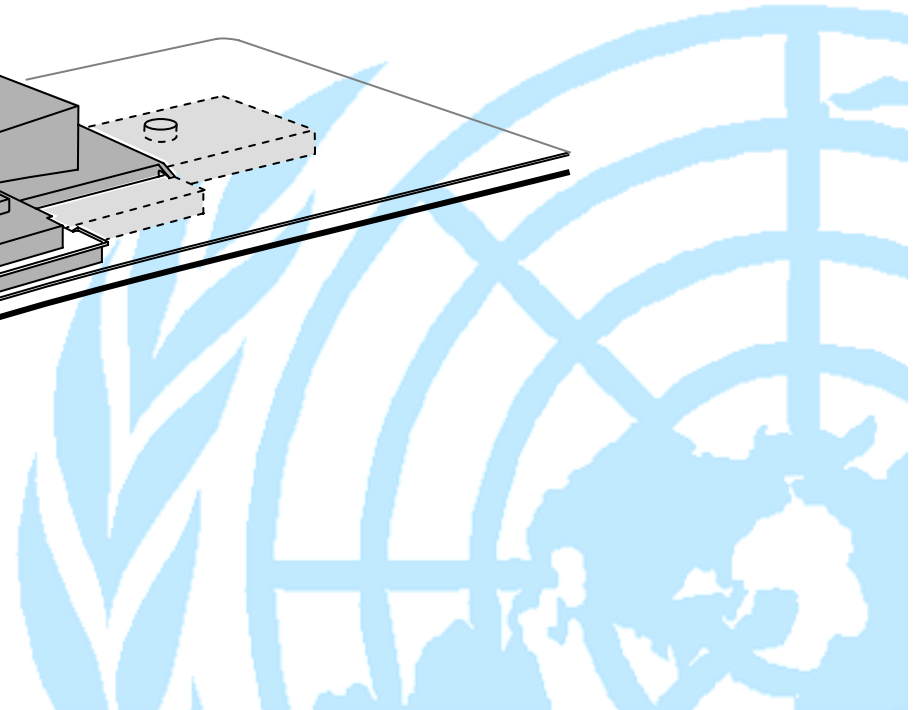
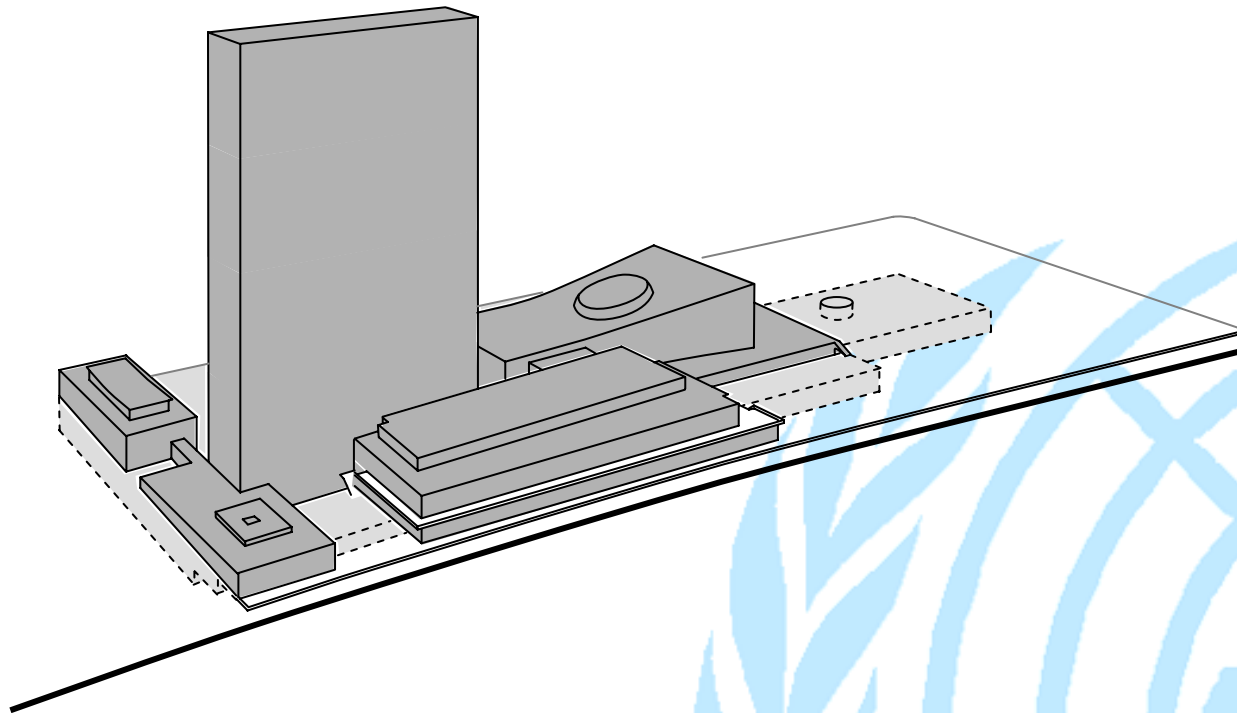


UN Capital Master Plan
Asbestos Abatement in the Library Building
May 2009

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Work area prepared for the removal of asbestos-containing floor tiles. Critical barriers seal off the ceiling, the walls, and all openings into the work area.



Abatement work area. Negative air machine creating underpressure by pumping filtered air out through a HEPA filter. Exits to waste decontamination and worker decontamination units are seen in the back.



To prevent asbestos fibers from becoming airborne, amended water is sprayed over the asbestos-containing material before and during the abatement



Asbestos-containing waste is bagged. It will be put in a leak-tight container in the waste decontamination unit.



Air samples are taken outside and inside the work area before, during and after the removal of asbestos-containing material
