- (4) Contribution category: Air, Communications, Engineers, Headquarters, Infantry, Logistics, Medical Services, Military Observers, Navy and Specialized Units.
- (5) Description. **Do not include units or individuals deployed in missions or not on stand-by during the period considered (quarter)**. Member States pledging Infantry Brigades and Battle Groups are requested to break down these into units (See (8) b.). Specify type of units or individuals suggested in the following table: This table is not exhaustive.

- (6) Personnel: strength in numbers, e.g. 7, 120, 600, 750.
- (7) Response time: It is the time that elapses between the receipt of a formal request from the UN, by the Permanent Representative of the Member State concerned, and the moment when the national resources are ready for deployment at a specified point of embarkation. Specify the response time in days e.g. 30, 45, 60, 90.
- (8) Remarks. As detailed as possible.
  - a. For Individuals: Specify particulars, e.g. languages, skills, specialties, etc. of staff officers and military observers, for new missions or for replacements and new vacancies in ongoing missions.
  - b. For Units: Specify data on Major Equipment, Self-sustainment and Self-sufficiency. See Manual on Policies and Procedures Concerning Reimbursement and Control of Contingent Owned Equipment of Troops Contributors Participating in Peacekeeping Missions (COE Manual Edition 2002). Indicate if the unit is in the UNSAS Rapid Deployment Level (RDL) and/or earmarked for a Regional/International Stand-by Arrangement supporting United Nations peacekeeping operations or if it is a component of a coherent brigade size contribution.
