Decision by the Fellowship Selection Committee on the 2009-2010 Fellowship Awards

1. Pursuant to Article III (2.3A) and Article V of Annex A of the aforementioned Technical Cooperation Agreement, the Fellowship Selection Committee was established with the mandate “to review the applications submitted by interested developing country officials, and select those which will be awarded Project fellowships.” The composition of the Selection Committee was as follows:

2. The Selection Committee convened at offices of DOALOS in the United Nations Headquarters, New York (USA) on 30 October 2008.

3. After considering 47 applications from 29 States, the Selection Committee proceeded with short-listing the most qualified candidates. From this shortlist, the Selection Committee agreed that 10 of these candidates would be granted fellowship awards, and four would be selected as reserve candidates.

4. The Selection Committee further agreed that in considering the candidates for fellowship awards, in addition to the relevant provisions of the Technical Cooperation Agreement, it would also be guided by the “Fellowship Selection Criteria” applied by the United Nations System Organizations.

5. Following its deliberations, **the Selection Committee selected the following ten candidates for 2009-2010 Fellowship awards** (listed in alphabetical order):
