On December 14, 1990 the United Nations General Assembly voted to establish October 1 as the International Day of Older Persons (Resolution 45/106). The holiday was observed for the first time on October 1, 1991.

Vienna, Austria, 26 July - 6 August 1982

The decision to hold the Assembly was taken by the UN General Assembly-33 in 1978: **The Assembly on the Elderly**

In 1980 (GA-35), the name of the Assembly was changed to the **World Assembly on Ageing** “ *in view of the interrelatedness of the issues of ageing individuals and the ageing of populations*”

In 1981, at GA-36, it was decided “that the World Assembly on Aging will be held in **Vienna** from **26 July** to **6 August 1982**”
– *11 days! Plus two days of pre-congress consultations!*
(*Second World Assembly: 5 days+...*)

1993: Third Review & Appraisal

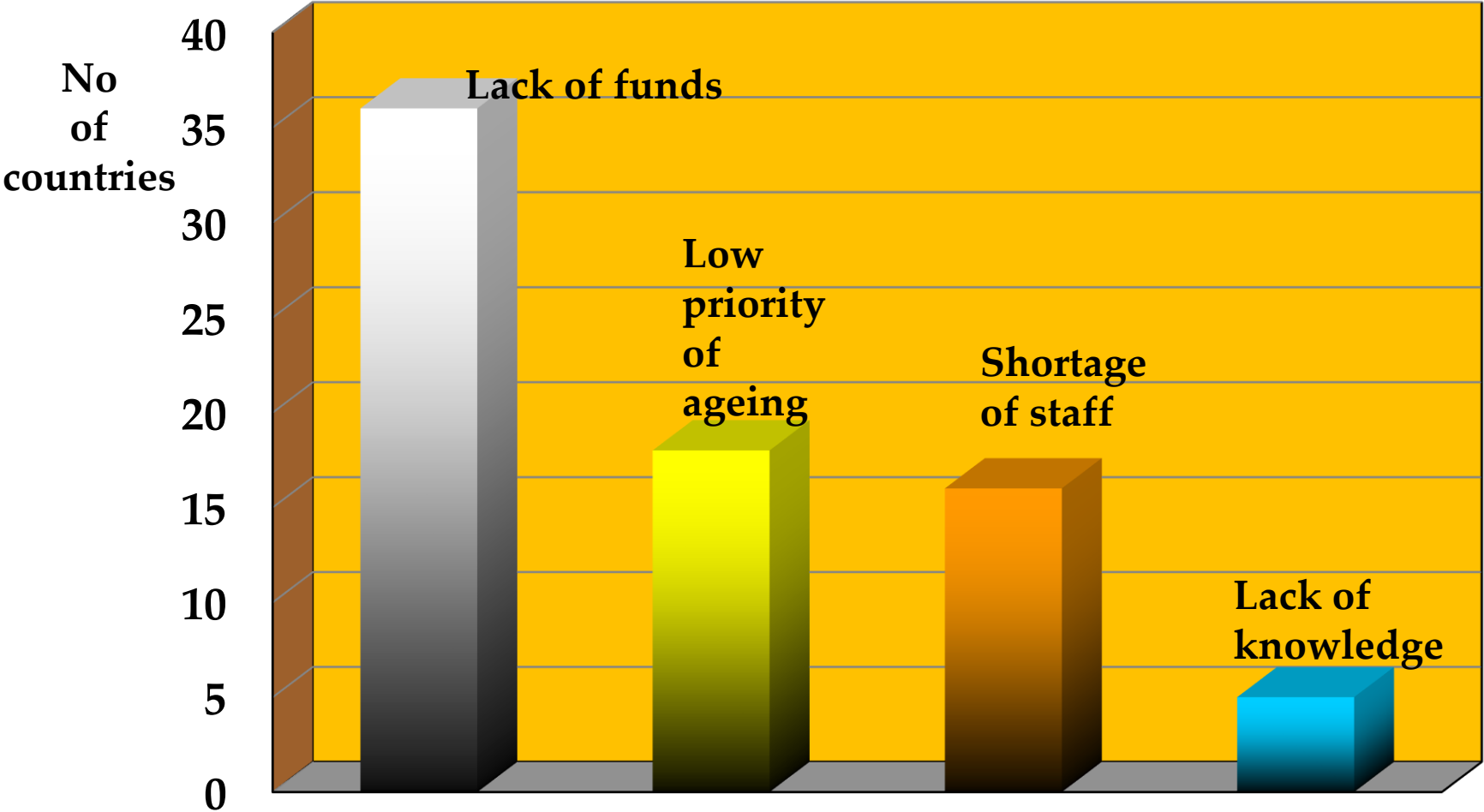

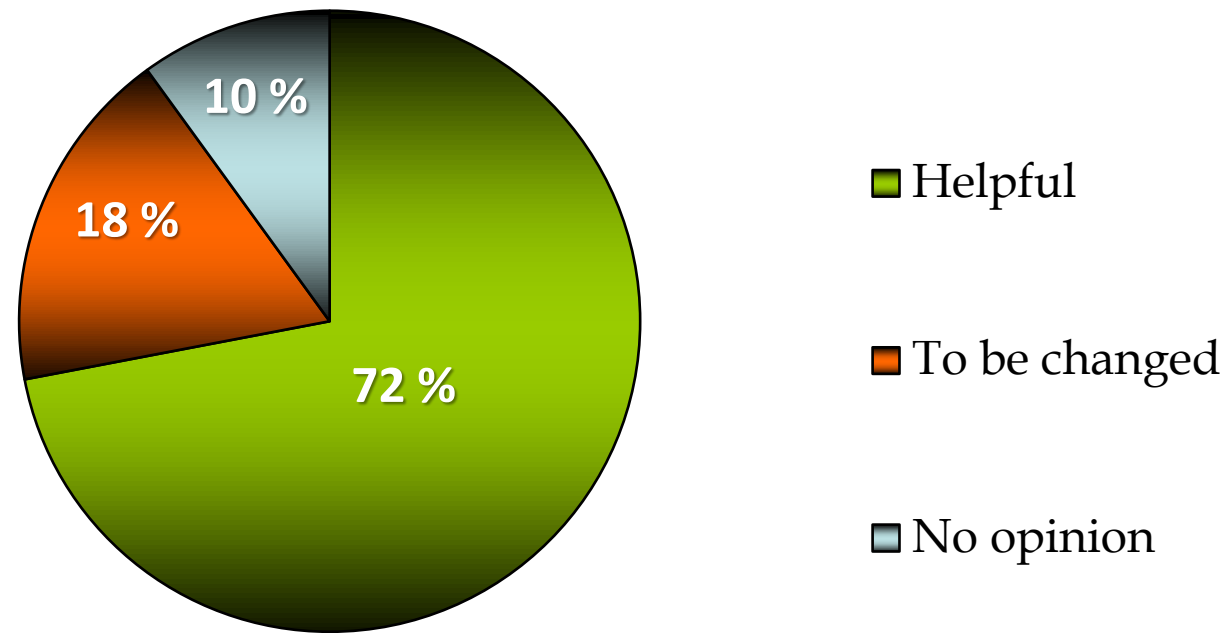

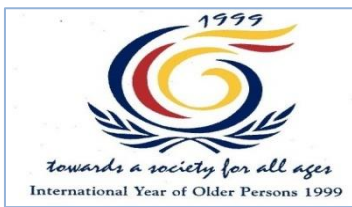

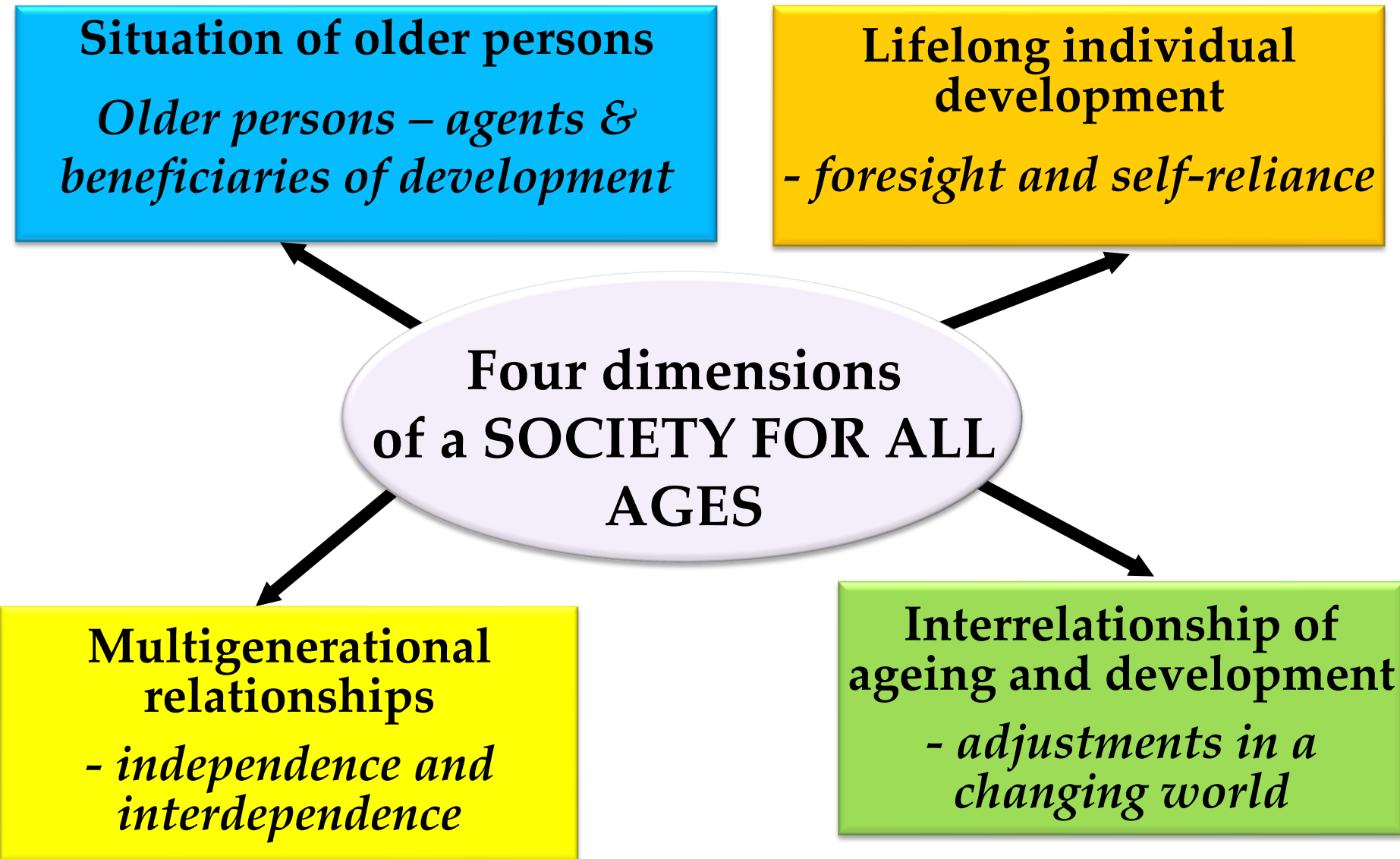

General Assembly - 53 (1999)

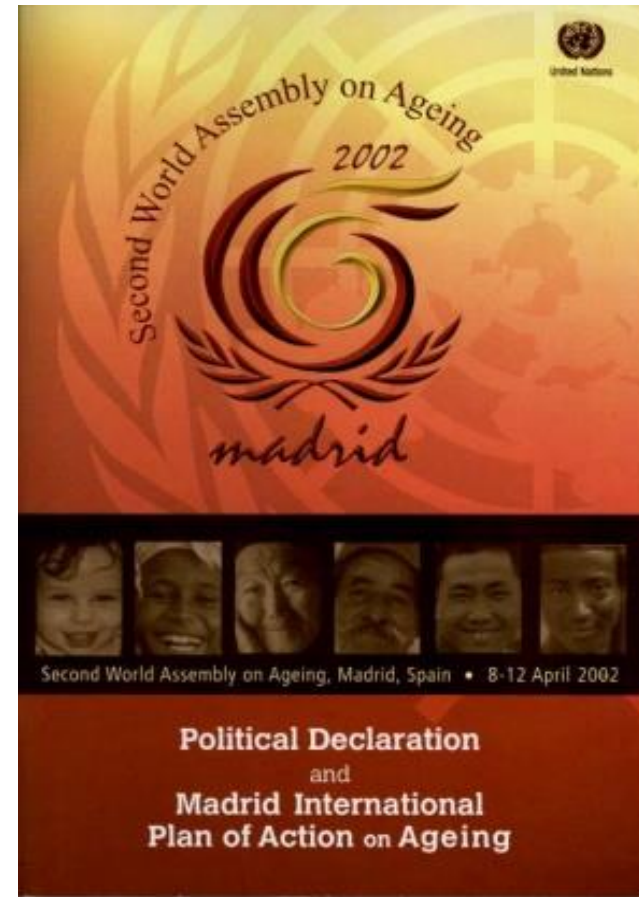
14. Decides to entrust the Commission for Social Development with the **revision** of the International Plan of Action on Ageing and the **elaboration of a long-term strategy on ageing**, based on new developments since 1982 and on the experience of the **International Year of Older Persons in 1999**, with a view to the adoption of a **revised plan of action** and of a **long-term strategy on ageing in 2002**



General Assembly - 54 (2000)

1. Decides to convene the Second World Assembly on Ageing in 2002, on the occasion of the twentieth anniversary of the first World Assembly on Ageing held at Vienna, to be devoted to the **overall review of the outcome of the first World Assembly**, as well as to the **adoption of a revised plan of action and a long-term strategy on ageing**, encompassing its periodic reviews, **in the context of a society for all ages**

3. Accepts the offer of the Government of Spain to host the Second World Assembly on Ageing, and decides that the Second World Assembly shall be held in Spain in April 2002

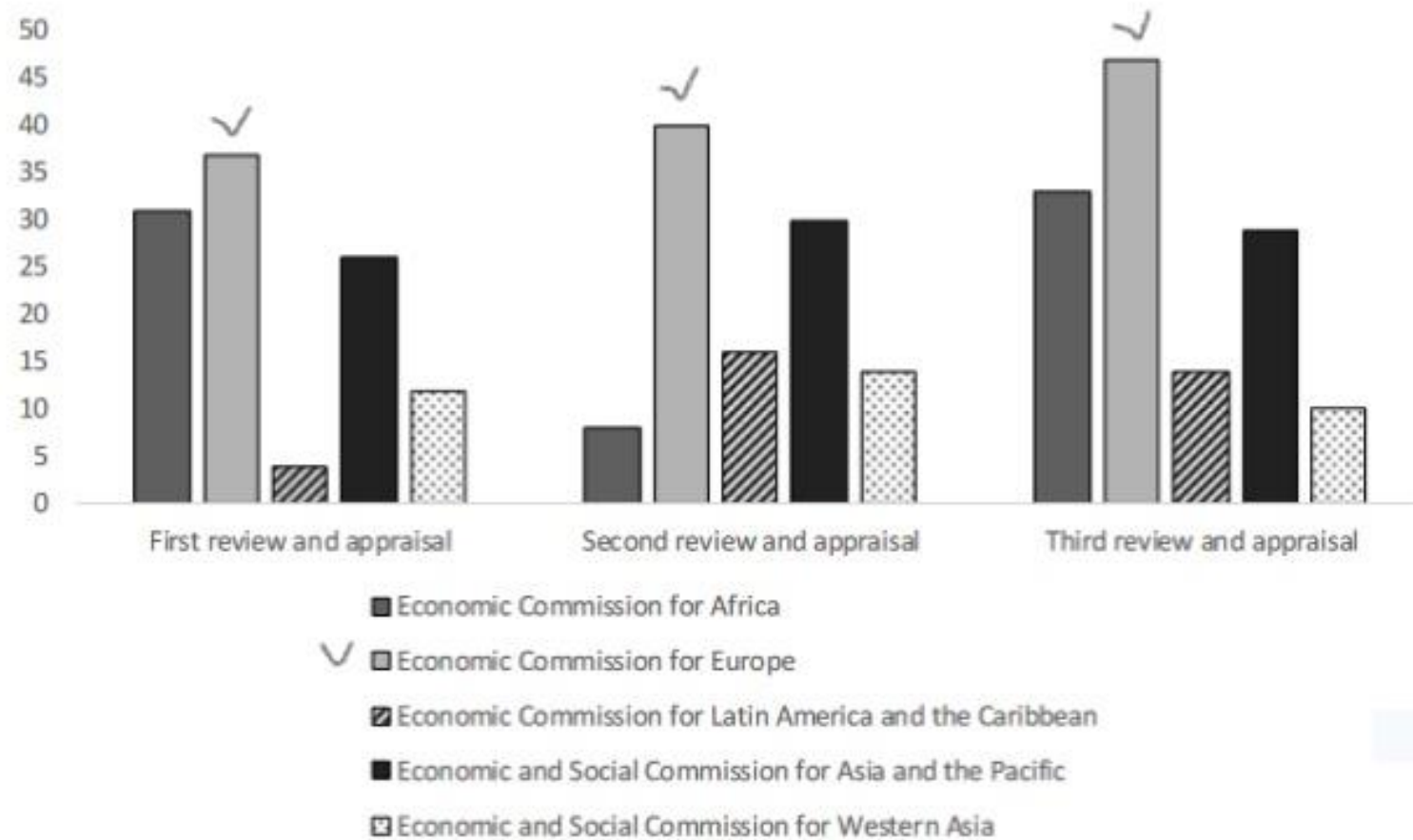

- Works towards **integrating** population ageing and MIPAA with the 2030 Agenda and other relevant global programmes and platforms of action.

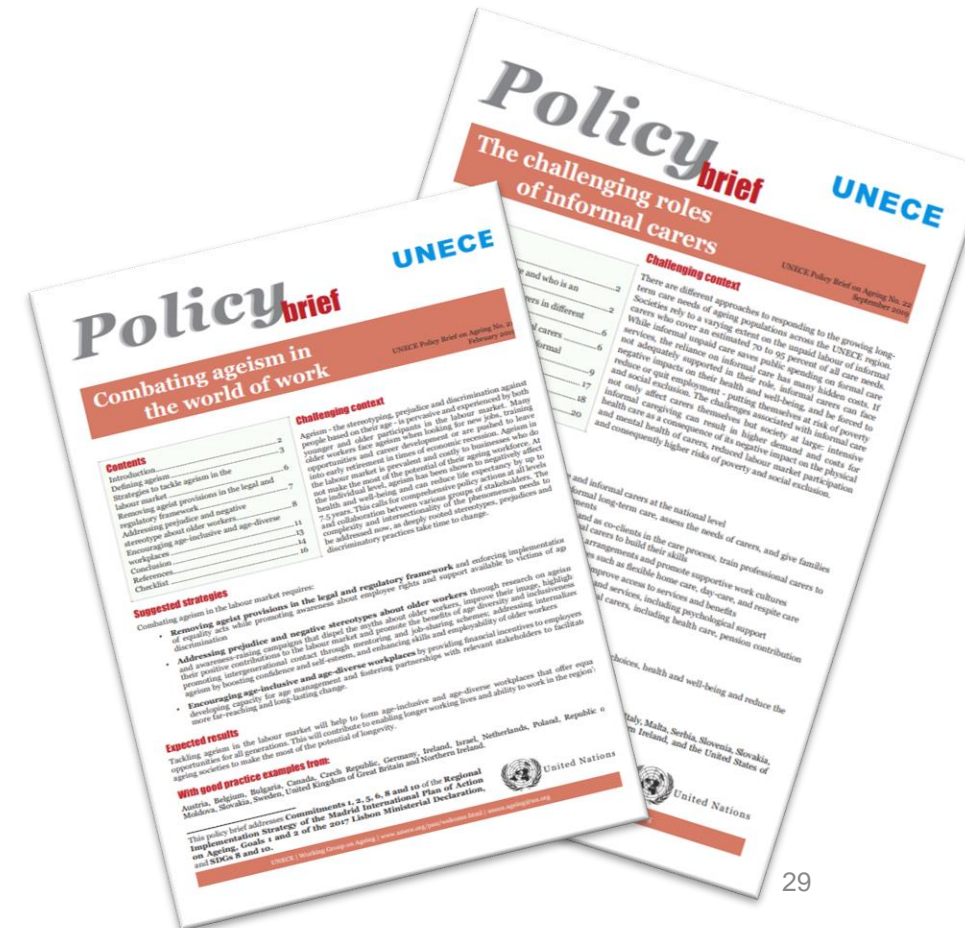

- Launch in 2021 - Portugal's presidency of Council of the EU, side event at OEWG-A

Synergies between the SWGA & OEWGA

- Information exchange
 - The SWGA & OEWGA want to improve the situation for older persons
 - The Human Rights approach focus on the basic legal needs, the bottom line of everybodies rights. It does not aim to suggest in depth policy directions.
 - On the other side, MIPAA and the RIS (*Lisbon Ministerial Delaration*) can go a step further than the HR approach and focus on policy principles & recommendations

Synergies between the SWGA & OEWGA

- Presence at the annual conferences in April/May & November
 - Install an open communication between the representatives at the SWGA and the OEWGA
- Side events at the annual conferences
 - If possible side events should be organized at both events, to offer the chance common discussions
 - Invite keypersons like the Independent Expert on the enjoyment of all human rights by older persons or the chair of the SWGA

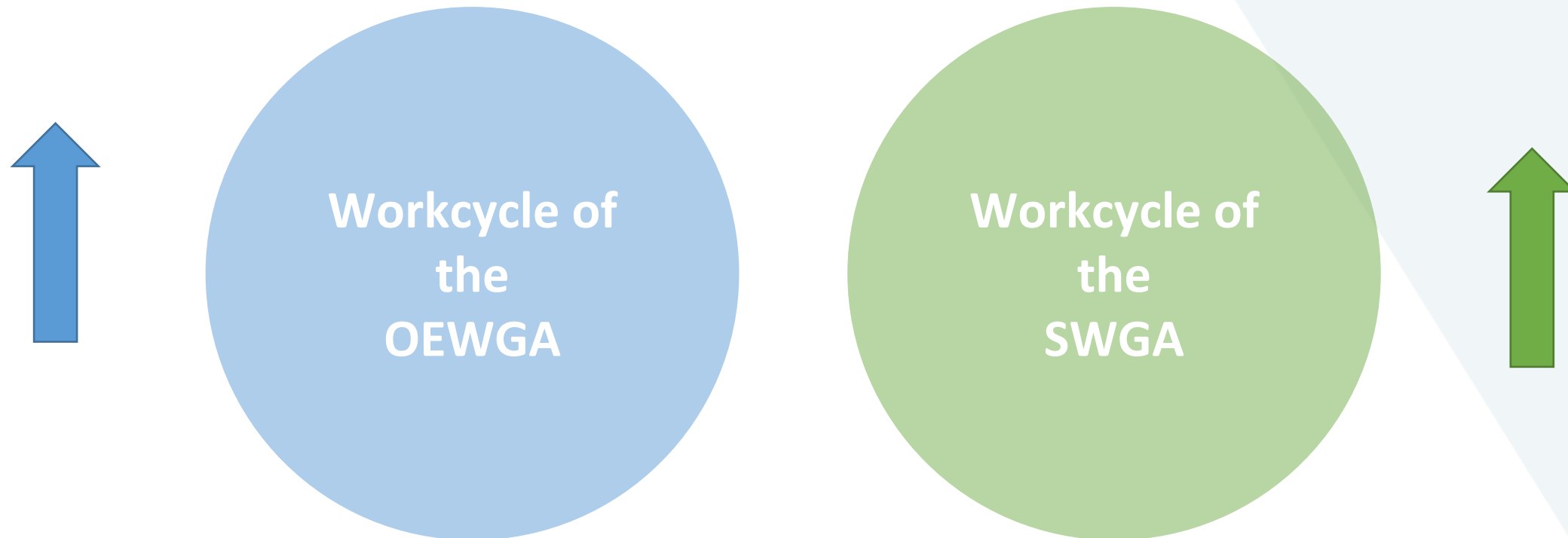
Synergies between the SWGA & OEWGA

- 75th Session of the Third Committee
 - Reaffirmation of MiPAA also in context with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development
 - Identify possible gaps & how best to address them
 - Age discrimination
 - Neglect
 - Abuse & violence
 - Social isolation & loneliness
 - Access to food & housing
 - Access to health care services
 - Access to employment
 - Access to legal capacities & justice

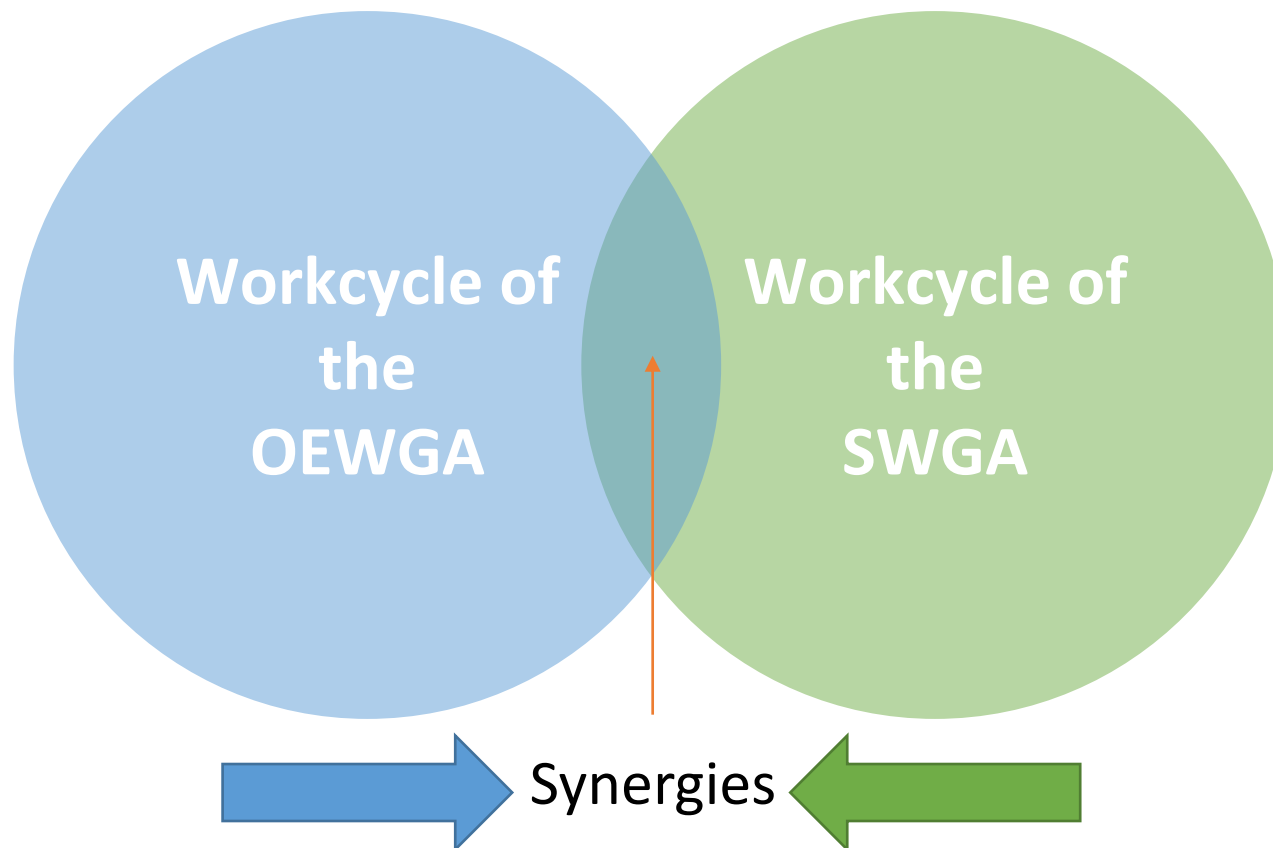
Synergies between the SWGA & OEWGA

- 75th Session of the Third Committee
 - Appreciation of close coordination b/w all UN Entities, while avoiding unnecessary duplications
 - Strengthen existing networks of national focal points on ageing

- Last annual meeting in 2020 was postponed
 - New date is not yet confirmed
 - Finalization of an OHCHR Study on Normative Gaps in the existing HR Legislation
 - Evaluation of the Latin-American and African Convention on Protecting Human Rights of Older Persons
 - In this regard it would be highly interesting to learn about the UNECE's position on such a document
