Town Hall Poll Results


According to our Town Hall surveys with 633 registered from 29 countries:

98% responded during this COVID-19 pandemic, disability-led organizations do NOT have what they need to serve their communities;

100% believe disability-led organizations definitely or sometimes are left out of disaster relief funding from foundations, corporations and government;

96% reported these Town Halls would be useful to participate in disability disaster relief funding discussions;

93% reported they would like to be a part of an alliance between disability-led organizations and funders that could accelerate resources








