- ✓ fosters social cohesion, citizenship and cultural interaction
- ✓ increases mobility and transport efficiency

Approaches to controlling public space

1. urban furniture of exclusion, and

2. local regulations on urban decorum and security.







Regulating the use of public space

- Strategies for controlling and regulating certain types of behaviour in public spaces, which outlaw activities such as drinking, sleeping on benches, begging, washing in fountains and so on, are growing in many cities.
- In one year, from September 2008 to September 2009, 788 local ordinances were implemented in 455 Italian municipalities, in order to fight the "illegal occupation of public space" and to ensure "decorum in the city"




