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
## **Starting point – The Covid-19 crisis**

#### **Massive destruction of jobs**

#### Strong rise in inequality

- → Poorer households
- → Youth
- → Women

#### Unique health challenges






#### **Short-term measures and the Future of Work**

Limited support in low- and middle-income countries

Current recovery measures focus on unsustainable industries and maintain existing job mix

Risk of accelerating automation and destruction of jobs

## A Human-centered approach towards Socially Just Transitions

#### **Challenge:**

- 1. Adress (pre-)existing inequalities (gender, occupational, skills)
- 2. Encourage transitions towards environmentally and socially sustainable jobs
- 3. Combine environmental and social goals



## Encourage new business models: Social and solidarity economy

- 1. Support governments towards the endorsement of a UN Resolution on the SSE
- 2. Set up a global knowledge platform on the SSE
- 3. Launching global programme towards creating an enabling environment for Social Enterprises in developing economies.
- 4. Address short-term focus caused by excessive financialization
- → Encourage best practices around CSR



# A human-centered approach: Encourage responsible consumption and production

#### Remove energy subsidies:

→ Address poverty alleviation through expanded social protection

#### **Ensure more equitable taxation**

→ Remove incentives for automation; tax the digital economy

#### Create social wealth funds to achieve national development goals

→ Use expanded role of the state during Covid-19 crisis for stronger long-term focus of economic expansion



## A human-centered approach: Re- and up-skilling

#### Vocational education and training programs towards green jobs

- → Involve private sector in identifying skills and develop curriculae
- → Life-long learning approach to also help older workers to transition

#### Help identify occupational pathways

→ Occupational shift within and across industries

#### Encourage the use of new technologies for a transition towards a circular economy

→ Use of AI to identify emerging skills and activities



# A human-centered approach: Social protection and public employment programs

#### **Provide universal social protection**

→ Timely and universal support to help address both the health and the social crisis

#### **Ensure long-term security of incomes**

→ India's NREGA program

#### **Create public assets**

- → Example: Ethopia's Productive Safety Net Program
- → Uruguay's Community Activities Program
