Dear participants of the regional workshop on "Evidence-based ageing-related policies in Sub-Saharan Africa",

I wish to acknowledge the professional caliber of the presenters who came to Kenya to talk about their respective areas of expertise working for Governments, statistical offices, academia, civil society organizations, and human rights organizations.
