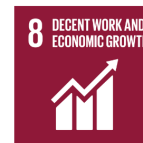

- Engage multistakeholder perspectives in an interactive discussion

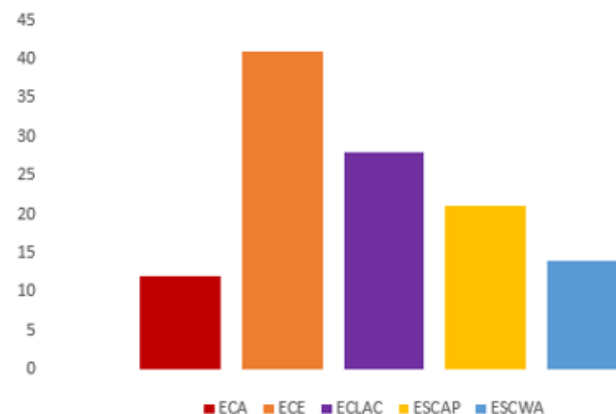
The 4th Review and Appraisal cycle MIPAA, still forward-looking at 20

- ❖ The Fourth Review and Appraisal cycle took place against the background of a devastating COVID-19 pandemic, which directly or indirectly cost the lives of over **12 million older persons in 24 months, with more than half in lower middle-income countries.**
- ❖ 4 out of 7 Member States participated in the Fourth Review and Appraisal cycle, representing **84 per cent of where older persons reside worldwide.**

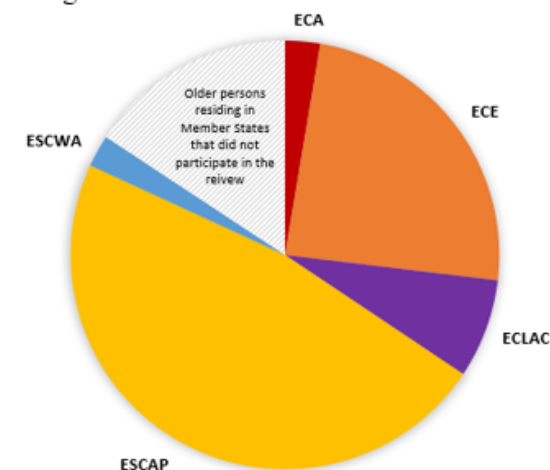

Total population (60+) in 2022, by residence in Member States that participated in the fourth review and appraisal process, by regional commission



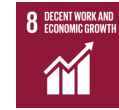

3-6pm: Emerging issues: Addressing the social impacts of multi-faceted crises to accelerate recovery from the lingering effects of the pandemic through the full implementation of the 2030 Agenda

- Share experiences on how countries are managing the multifaceted crises including the climate emergency, conflict, cost of living crisis and lingering impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Share lessons on how to accelerate action to deliver sustainable development during this time of crises.
- Share national experiences on protecting the most vulnerable from the impacts of the multiple crises.
- Re-invigorate a multi-stakeholder coalition for action at the national and international level to accelerate progress towards achieving sustainable development.



Day 4: Thursday, 9 February

10am-1pm: Interactive dialogue with senior officials of the UN Systems

- Link the Commission's work with regional and national actions for enhanced coordination and strengthened policy coherence
- Assist Member States to overcome inequalities to accelerate the recovery from the COVID-19 and the full implementation of the 2030 Agenda
- Highlight current trends, good practices, innovative approaches, and lessons learned
- Identify common challenges across regions and promote linkages between regional strategies and global normative frameworks

The outcomes of the dialogue will reinforce the linkage between the CSocD and the Regional Sustainable Development Forums for the 2023 HLPF.

3-6pm: Multi-stakeholder Forum: Sharing solutions

- Share experiences on how different stakeholders can work together with governments to design and implement policies that help countries create full, productive and decent employment to recover better.

- Share measures towards formalization of employment.

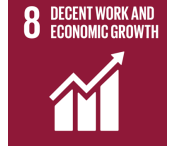
