

Over the years, Her Majesty has been actively involved in promoting social causes with an emphasis in the areas of health and education.

Her Majesty recognizes the importance of ensuring that health issues are recognized as an integral part of the overall social and economic development process. She believes in the importance of ensuring physical, mental and social well-being at the family, community and national levels.

Her initiative, RENEW (respect, educate, nurture and empower women), founded in 2004, works to increase the empowerment of disadvantaged women and adolescents nationwide.
