Professor, London School of Economics

Tim Dyson is Professor of Population Studies in the Department of International Development at the London School of Economics. Educated in England and Canada, he has held visiting positions at the Australian National University in Canberra, the International Institute of Population Sciences in Mumbai, and the American University of Beirut. In 1994-96 he was President of the British Society for Population Studies, and in 2001 he was elected a Fellow of the British Academy. His main areas of research have been on demographic time series, interactions between populations and food supplies, famine demography, HIV/AIDS, urbanization, child mortality, climate change, democratization, and the past, present and future population of the Indian subcontinent. His latest book is Population and Development – the Demographic Transition, published by Zed Books in 2010. His latest article is 'On Demographic and Democratic Transitions', Population and Development Review 38.
