The Kuwaiti authorities wish to affirm their support for the content of General Assembly resolution 54/174, which is conducive to the promotion of the highest standards of human rights and their realization in all fields and in all States, without exception. In this connection, they consider that there is a need for further efforts and more international cooperation in order to find a rapid and comprehensive solution to wars which break out, in which individuals are subjected to gross violations of their human rights, and the humanitarian and environmental consequences of those wars, such as the problem of displaced persons fleeing therefrom, which places a heavy and unexpected burden on the State hosting those refugees, all of whom require accommodation, food and medicine, as well as the problem of the pollution and destruction of the environment, which necessitates the diversion of resources for its rehabilitation.
