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Programme budget for the biennium 2000-2001

Revised estimates in respect of matters of which the Security Council is seized

Seventh report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions

1. The Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions has considered the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/55/30) on estimates in respect of five political missions of which the Security Council is seized: the United Nations Political Office in Bougainville, the United Nations Office in Burundi, United Nations assistance to the Facilitator of the Burundi peace process, the Adviser of the Secretary-General for Special Assignments in Africa and the Special Adviser of the Secretary-General on Cyprus. During its consideration of the matter, the Committee met with representatives of the Secretary-General, who provided additional information.

2. The Advisory Committee notes that the report of the Secretary-General is being submitted in the context of actions taken by the Security Council regarding good offices, preventive diplomacy and post-conflict peace-building missions. These actions have been taken on the basis of requests from Governments and/or recommendations of the Secretary-General.

3. As indicated in paragraph 28 of the report, the total cost of the activities of the five missions described therein is estimated at \$4,162,500. The estimate is based mainly on performance in 2000.

4. The Advisory Committee notes that the report of the Secretary-General to the General Assembly at its

fifty-fourth session (A/C.5/54/39) included eight special political missions at an estimated cost of \$9,964,500. Upon enquiry, the Committee was informed that a number of the special political missions that had been included in the previous report of the Secretary-General had been provided for in the revised estimates for the biennium 2000-2001 contained in the first performance report of the Secretary-General on the programme budget for the biennium 2000-2001 (A/55/645 and Corr.1 and Add.1). The report of the Committee on the first performance report contains additional information in this respect (see A/55/7/Add.5, annex IV). The Committee was informed that the missions covered in the report under consideration were those on which the Security Council had not yet taken a decision as of the time of the issuance of the first performance report. Upon request, the Committee was provided with detailed information on all of the special political missions covered in the report under consideration, as well as in the first performance report, including duration and estimated costs (see annex).

5. The Advisory Committee notes, as indicated in table 2 and annex II.B, paragraph 1, of document A/C.5/55/30, that an additional Field Service post is requested for the United Nations Office in Burundi. This is the only request for additional staff contained in

the report. The Committee was informed that other increases in the estimates for international and local staff in a number of the missions relate to the use of lower vacancy rates for 2001. This is the case, for example, with the United Nations Office in Burundi where, for 2000, the vacancy factor used was 15 per cent. As indicated in annex II.B, paragraph 1, of the report, a vacancy factor of 5 per cent was used for the estimates for 2001. The Committee was informed that, for the United Nations Political Office in Bougainville, additional requirements related mainly to the fact that no vacancies were anticipated and to additional requirements for travel of staff between New York and Bougainville and travel within the mission area. With regard to the Adviser of the Secretary-General for Special Assignments in Africa, the Advisory Committee was informed that additional requirements for international and local staff reflected the fact that advisory services had begun in February 2000. The figures for 2001 thus represent the full cost of the mission.

6. The Advisory Committee was also informed that the difference in the estimated requirements for 2000 (\$530,400) and 2001 (\$45,300) under transport operations for the United Nations Office in Burundi was due to costs of non-recurrent items purchased in 2000.

7. The Advisory Committee notes the statement in paragraph 30 of the report that “as all resources under the provision for special political missions have been earmarked as of this date, the established procedures under General Assembly resolution 41/213 of 19 December 1986 will be operative, and thus the financing for these activities would require an additional appropriation.” Accordingly, the Committee recommends an additional appropriation of \$4,162,500 under section 3, Political affairs, of the programme budget for the biennium 2000-2001.¹
