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Section 18

Economic development in Europe

(Programme 16 of the medium-term plan for the period 2002-2005)

Overview

- 18.1 The programme is under the responsibility of the Economic Commission for Europe (ECE).
- 18.2 The programme of work to be carried out by the Commission in the biennium 2002-2003 is in conformity with the ECE Plan of Action and the overall objectives of the medium-term plan for the period 2002-2005 (A/55/6/Rev.1). In line with the role of the regional commissions as set forth in Economic and Social Council resolution 1998/46 of 31 July 1998 and with the goals of the Millennium Declaration, the main objectives of ECE will be: (a) to foster sustainable development in the countries of the region with a focus on creating a favourable environment for growth, improving the quality of life and increasing the security of the people; and (b) to promote the economic integration of ECE countries both among themselves and with the rest of the world, with a focus on addressing transboundary issues, promoting the harmonization of policies and stimulating trade and investment flows.
- 18.3 The overall strategy of ECE is designed around eight interdependent and complementary subprogrammes. The strategy involves the elaboration of economic data, studies and policy analysis, the negotiation of conventions, norms and guidelines, and the provision of technical assistance.
- 18.4 In the biennium 2002-2003, the analytical work of ECE will aim at producing analyses which are more policy-oriented so as to offer a good basis for policy debates among member States and to facilitate their decision-making on various economic and social issues. These analyses, supported by statistics on all the countries of the region, will also contribute to promoting a better understanding and exchange of information and experience on these issues.
- 18.5 The focus in terms of normative activities will be to promote the effective implementation of ECE conventions, norms and standards, in particular in countries with economies in transition. ECE will also focus on the development of interlinkages both among conventions in a given sector and between conventions relating to complementary sectors. Updating of existing conventions, norms and standards will be carried out and the development of a number of new legal instruments will be initiated.
- 18.6 Technical assistance will be provided, mainly in the form of advisory services, training workshops and projects. This aims at strengthening national capacity in countries with economies in transition, promoting best practices and corresponding guidelines and, for specific projects, bringing together the actors involved in their design, financing and implementation. This type of support will be provided for both individual countries and groups of countries through activities organized with subregional groupings and subregional initiatives.
- 18.7 ECE will cooperate with other international organizations active in Europe, in particular regional institutions and subregional groupings. This cooperation will provide a broader framework for exchanging views among organizations on issues of particular concern to the countries of the region. It will also ensure consistency in technical assistance from different organizations and in financial support from various donors — an important condition for more efficient management of development aid on the part of the recipients.

- 18.8 ECE relationships with the business community and NGOs will be further strengthened, in view of the important contribution that they make to the achievement of the overall objectives of the ECE as mentioned in paragraph 18.2 above. In particular, new public/private partnerships will be initiated with a view to fostering financing for development in the region.
- 18.9 Furthermore, a new emphasis will be placed on cross-sectoral issues and intersectoral linkages. In terms of cross-sectoral issues, particular attention will be paid to improving gender mainstreaming in ECE subprogrammes; and information and communications technologies will be a new concern to be taken up. As for intersectoral linkages, the focus will be placed on transport, environment and health; energy and environment; transport and energy; and trade and environment.
- 18.10 Finally, in view of the role of the regional commissions as regional outposts of the United Nations, which has been emphasized by the Economic and Social Council in its resolution 1998/46, ECE will be addressing the increasing demands related to the regional contributions to the preparation of and follow-up to United Nations global conferences.
- 18.11 As required by the Plan of Action adopted by ECE member countries in April 1997, all ECE principal subsidiary bodies have prioritized their respective programme of activities, and the Group of Experts on the Programme of Work reviewed the programmes of work of the principal subsidiary bodies and recommended no changes in the distribution of resources among subprogrammes. The Group met in the autumn of 2000. Its recommendations were endorsed by the Commission in November 2000.
- 18.12 Resources for the biennium 2002-2003 under this section amount to \$37,880,300, reflecting an increase of \$465,700 (or 1.2 per cent). The change in the distribution of resources reflected in table 18.2 can be summarized as follows:
- (a) The increase under executive direction and management in the amount of \$215,800 is the result of:
 - (i) The establishment of one new P-5 post for a gender focal point officer who will ensure a gender mainstreaming perspective in the work of ECE;
 - (ii) The delayed impact of the P-4 post established in the biennium 2000-2001;
 - (iii) Reduced requirements for external translation and printing;
 - (b) The decrease of \$856,100 under programme of work is the result of the following:
 - (i) A decrease of \$25,200 under posts reflecting: the establishment of a new P-4 post, under the subprogramme on transport, to strengthen the services provided for the reconfigured Committee of Experts on the Transport of Dangerous Goods and on the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals (see Economic and Social Council resolution 1999/65 of 26 October 1999); establishment of two new P-2 posts under the subprogramme on Statistics; and the abolition of two General Service posts also under the subprogramme on Statistics in order to reflect the changing functions of the posts concerned;
 - (ii) A decrease of \$137,900 under other staff and contractual services due to reduced requirements for general temporary assistance (\$113,200) under the subprogramme on transport and for external translation and printing under various subprogrammes (\$24,700);
 - (iii) A decrease of \$693,000 resulting from the consolidation under programme support of the provisions for computer processing, telecommunications, data storage and other

specialized information technology services which used to be distributed under the relevant subprogrammes;

- (c) The increase of \$1,106,000 under Programme support is the net result of the following:
- (i) An increase of \$693,000 resulting from the consolidation under programme support of the provisions for computer processing, telecommunications, data storage and other specialized information services which used to be distributed under the subprogrammes;
 - (ii) An increase of \$430,200 to enable ECE to strengthen its information technology platform with a view to sustaining the current requirements of the Commission's substantive subprogrammes;
 - (iii) A decrease of \$17,200 due to reduced requirements for external translation and printing.

18.13 The amount of \$11,937,400 for extrabudgetary resources for the biennium 2002-2003 represents 24 per cent of the total resources available to this programme. These resources will be utilized to supplement resources from the regular budget, primarily to finance the organization of workshops, seminars and symposia for the countries in the region, particularly in countries with economies in transition; to support the implementation of the conventions on the environment adopted within the framework of ECE; to support cooperative agreements signed by various ECE member States on transport; and to share best practices and stimulate contacts in various other areas of the programme of work.

18.14 The percentage distribution of resources under this section will be as shown in table 18.1.

- 18.15 Resources for administration and conference and general services for ECE are, unlike for other regional commissions, not included under its own programme budget. They are included in a consolidated fashion under section 27E, Administration, Geneva, in respect of administration and general services, and under section 2, General Assembly affairs and conference services, in respect of conference-servicing costs. They are thus administered by the United Nations Office at Geneva in an integrated fashion.
- 18.16 In order to permit a comparison among regional commissions while at the same time maintaining the advantages of integrated management and avoiding duplication of effort, the resources (at current rates) to be provided by the United Nations Office at Geneva for ECE for administrative, conference and general services during the biennium 2002-2003 are summarized in table 18.4.

A. Policy-making organs

- 18.17 The Commission, which reports to the Economic and Social Council, provides the work of the secretariat with overall direction. It meets annually for three or four working days, supplemented by ad hoc informal one-day sessions every three months. It has seven principal subsidiary bodies: the Committee on Environmental Policy (subprogramme 1, Environment), which meets three days annually; the Inland Transport Committee (subprogramme 2, Transport), which meets three days annually; the Conference of European Statisticians (subprogramme 3, Statistics), which meets two and a half days annually; the Committee on Sustainable Energy (subprogramme 5, Sustainable energy), which meets three days annually; the Committee for Trade, Industry and Enterprise Development (subprogramme 6, Trade, industry and enterprise development), which meets two and a half days annually; the Timber Committee (subprogramme 7, Timber), which meets three days annually; and the Committee on Human Settlements (subprogramme 8, Human settlements), which meets two and a half days annually.
- 18.18 The Group of Experts on the Programme of Work meets every two years in the autumn prior to the preparation of the programme budget submission to provide the Commission with recommendations on possible adjustments and shifts in the ECE programme of work. In the course of the biennium, it also meets to take up specific issues as requested by the Commission and to review various aspects of the ECE work programme.
- 18.19 The recommendations of the Group of Experts on the Programme of Work, endorsed by the Commission, have been taken into account in the preparation of the programme budget proposals under this section. Furthermore, member States were provided with the programme narratives for review.

B. Executive direction and management

Resource requirements (before recosting): \$2,853,700

- 18.20 In order to fulfil its responsibilities in terms of executive direction and overall management of ECE, the Office of the Executive Secretary has the following functions:
- (a) To feed the policy debate on the strategic directions of ECE and to develop a forward-looking strategy for adjusting ECE activities to respond to emerging and foreseeable needs and priorities of its member States;
 - (b) To coordinate the ECE programme of work and to provide guidance and leadership for the implementation of all its subprogrammes. This includes issuance of policy guidelines and directives for the substantive divisions of the secretariat; preparation of the medium-term plan and the substantive part of the programme budget; oversight of the planning, monitoring and evaluation of the subprogrammes in accordance with the objectives of the medium-term

- plan and the programme budget; review and clearance of documentation prepared for the principal subsidiary bodies of ECE;
- (c) To ensure intersectoral linkages between ECE subprogrammes and the integration of cross-sectoral concerns in ECE activities;
 - (d) To provide the governing bodies of ECE with support: to service meetings of the Commission and its Bureau, including submission of reports to the Commission; to provide an interface between the Bureau of the Commission and the Bureaux of the Principal Subsidiary Bodies; and to ensure follow-up to decisions of the Commission;
 - (e) To provide support for the Group of Experts on the Programme of Work;
 - (f) To ensure the implementation of the directives of the Secretary-General;
 - (g) To ensure and report on the implementation of the resolutions and decisions of the General Assembly and the Economic and Social Council that are relevant to the work of ECE;
 - (h) To organize regional events and/or to provide regional contributions related to the preparation of and follow-up to United Nations global conferences and events, in accordance with the ECE role as a regional outpost of the United Nations, pursuant to Economic and Social Council resolution 1998/46;
 - (i) To ensure cooperation and coordination with other international organizations and institutions active in the region, both within and external to the United Nations; this includes the United Nations inter-agency coordination meetings and their follow-up;
 - (j) To involve the business community, academic institutions, local authorities and non-governmental organizations in ECE activities as appropriate and to obtain their support for implementation of those activities;
 - (k) To foster relationships with member Governments with a view to making ECE activities and achievements more widely known and used;
 - (l) To foster gender mainstreaming in ECE subprogrammes and to respond to requests from Headquarters in this area, including contributing to activities at the global level where a regional perspective and input are needed.

18.21 The Office of the Executive Secretary includes an Information Unit which, inter alia, works to increase the visibility of ECE through the dissemination of information about the products and activities of ECE to the public at large, the ECE membership and other potential users. Such dissemination is carried out through various channels, such as contact with the media and the Internet.

18.22 The increase for post requirements is the net result of the establishment of one new P-5 post for a gender focal point officer to ensure that the work of ECE reflects a gender perspective and of the delayed impact of the P-4 post established in the 2000-2001 biennium. The decrease under non-post is due to reduced requirements for external production of specialized publications.

18.23 The work under the subprogramme will be carried out by the Environment and Human Settlements Division. The programme of work has been formulated by drawing upon subprogramme 1 of programme 16 of the medium-term plan for the period 2002-2005.

- 18.24 The subprogramme is expected to achieve its objectives and expected accomplishments on the assumption that: (a) information and statistical data are available and provided by countries on their environmental situation, including reliable information for the preparation of environmental performance reviews of countries with economies in transition; (b) there is the political will to ratify or accede to environmental conventions and protocols; and (c) governmental and parliamentary decisions are made to establish, implement and enforce national legislation relating to the environmental conventions and protocol.

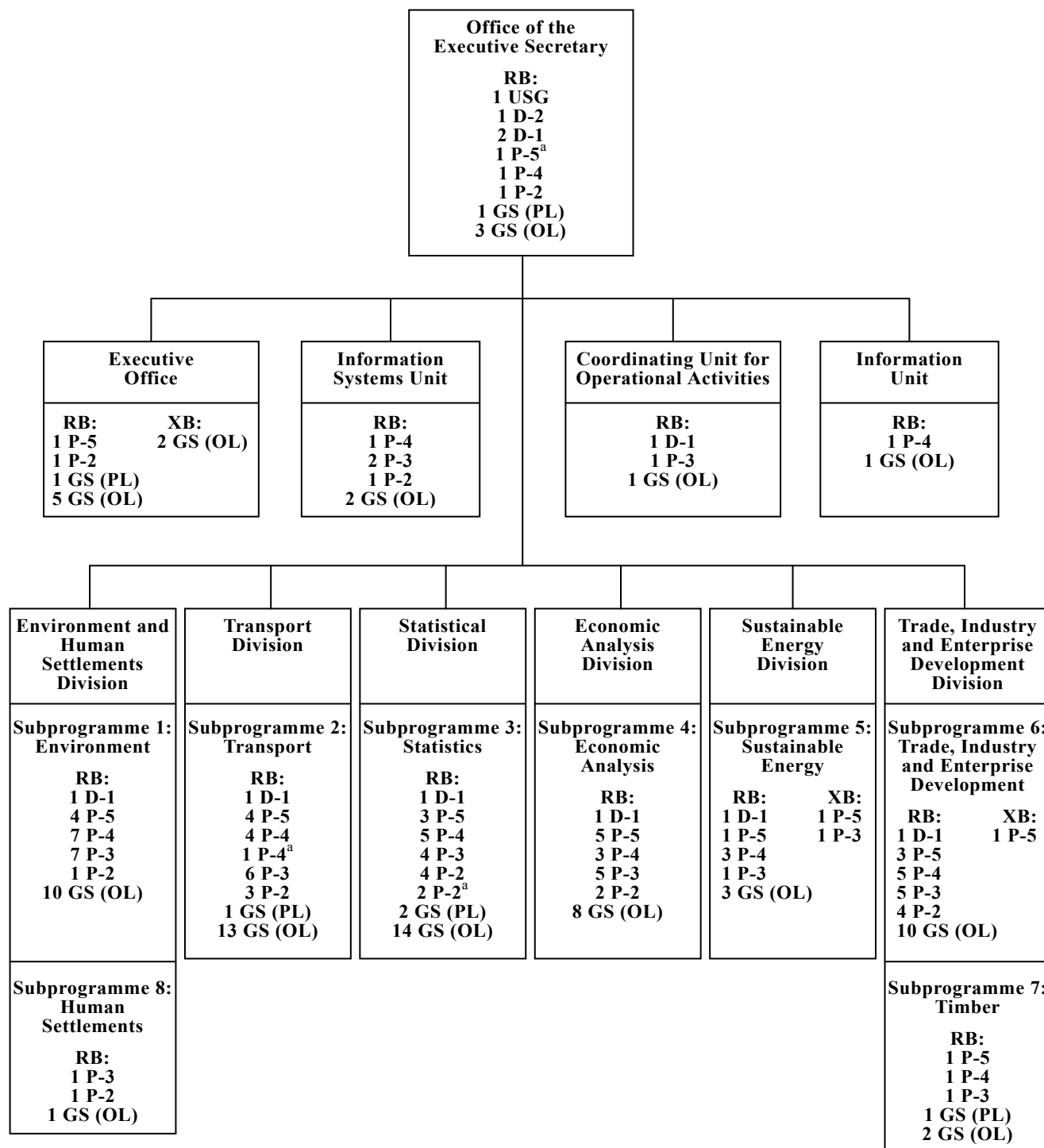

Resource requirements (at current rates)*Posts*

A.18.1 The requirements of \$2,550,400, reflecting an increase of \$225,100, provide for the posts shown in table A.18.5. The increase relates to:

- The establishment of a new P-5 post to promote and support gender mainstreaming in the ECE programme of work and to be responsible for meeting the increasing demand on the Commission to contribute to the organization of global events and conferences;
- The delayed impact of the P-4 post established in 2000-2001 biennium.

Consultants and experts

- A.18.2 The requirements of \$73,500, at the maintenance level, provide for specialized consultancy services required for the electronic and printed public information activities of ECE and for outside expertise to assist the Office of the Executive Secretary in preparing substantive documents and organizing activities relating to cross-sectoral activities not falling within or provided for under individual subprogrammes.

Travel of staff

- A.18.3 The provision of \$162,300, at the maintenance level, is required for the travel of the Executive Secretary and the staff of the Office of the Executive Secretary, including the deputy, for consultations with Governments, participation at intergovernmental meetings, maintaining contacts with other international, multilateral and subregional organizations, consultations with Headquarters, and coordination with other United Nations entities. The provision is also used for the Executive Secretary to travel with or to represent the Secretary-General when requested to do so.

Contractual services

- A.18.4 The requirements of \$53,900, reflecting a decrease of \$9,300, relate to external production, including translation, printing and binding, design of covers of specialized publications requested by ECE organs, as well as of brochures in non-United Nations official languages, especially in the languages of countries with economies in transition; the design and development of CD-ROMs on ECE activities which cannot be done in-house; the visual displays to advertise the work and activities of ECE at conferences, exhibits and meetings; and the proposed production of a film on ECE events and activities in and outside Geneva, including in countries with economies in transition.

Hospitality

- A.18.5 The requirements of \$13,600, at the maintenance level, for the Commission as a whole relate to group hospitality on the occasion of major meetings and to hospitality extended to representatives of member States and international organizations.

Resource requirements (at current rates)*Posts*

- A.18.10 The requirements of \$5,647,400, reflecting an increase of \$113,200, provide for the posts shown in table A.18.12. The increase is due to the establishment of one new P-4 post to strengthen the services provided for the Committee of Experts on the Transport of Dangerous Goods and on the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals and its two subcommittees. It is recalled that the Committee and its subcommittees were established by the Economic and Social Council in its resolution 1999/65 of 26 October 1999. Subsequently, the General Assembly at its fifty-fourth session approved an amount of \$149,800 to provide ECE with temporary assistance to carry out the additional activities entailed by Council resolution 1999/65.

Other staff costs

- A.18.11 A provision of \$14,800, reflecting a decrease of \$113,200, is required for general temporary assistance in connection with the preparation and holding of the meetings in 2002 of the Committee of Experts on the Transport of Dangerous Goods and on the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals and its two subcommittees. The decrease reflects reduced requirements as a result of the establishment of the new P-4 post referred to above.

Consultants and experts

- A.18.12 A provision of \$52,200, at the maintenance level, is required to cover specialized services not available in the secretariat to assist in the preparation of documentation and the development and implementation of ECE legal instruments in the field of transport; computerization of ECE regulations annexed to the 1958 Agreement on the Construction of Vehicles; the preparation of electronic maps of European road, rail, inland waterway and combined transport networks; and other specialized reports for review by the Commission's subsidiary bodies in the field of transport.

Travel of staff

- A.18.13 The requirements of \$61,400, at the maintenance level, relate to the costs of travel for consultation and participation in meetings concerning transport organized by other international organizations in the region; missions to provide advice to Governments on problems related to the implementation of ECE legal instruments in the field of transport; for meetings and consultations with Governments on Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals for its effective implementation; for consultations with the Office of Legal Affairs on questions related to ECE legal instruments on transport; and for participation in meetings on follow-up to the Regional Conference on Transport and the Environment.

Contractual services

- A.18.14 The amount of \$91,600, reflecting a decrease of \$15,700, covers the external printing costs of such publications as the *UN ECOSOC Recommendations on the Transport of Dangerous Goods (Model Regulations)*, *European Agreement concerning the International Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road (ADR)*, *Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals*, Map of E-Road Network and other publications under this subprogramme, including some in CD-ROM format. The decrease is due to the fact that fewer publications are printed externally and to the trend towards printing fewer and producing more publications in CD-ROM format, for which resources are provided under data-processing supplies.

Grants and contributions

- A.18.15 The reduction of \$62,800 is due to the redeployment of the provision for computer processing, telecommunications, data storage and other specialized information technology services to programme support, where it is administered centrally.

Resource requirements (at current rates)*Posts*

- A.18.16 The requirements of \$5,752,900, reflecting a decrease of \$275,600, provide for the posts shown in table A.18.14. The decrease is the net result of the abolition of two General Service posts, the establishment of two P-2 posts and the outward redeployment of one P-2 post to subprogramme 4, Economic analysis. The abolition of two General Service posts and the need for two new P-2 posts are due to the fact that powerful new information technology is now used directly by the Professional staff, resulting in less demand on General Service staff as an intermediary. In addition, there is a continuous increase in the work programme, which results in increasing demands on the Professional staff. An upgrade in the skills structure of the Division's staff is required. The original structure of the Division dates back to the period when a mainframe computer was used for data storage, and routine operations were time consuming. The focus is now on data quality, which requires the analysis of the data collected from an increased number of countries in the region by statisticians with strong academic training and experience. Moreover, increasingly statistics have to be provided in the context of policy-relevant indicators so that they can be applied to the policy

debate and benchmarking. While standard data collection and storage tasks performed by the General Service staff can be, and have been automated, the new functions require higher skill and professional experience. As regards the redeployment of the P-2 post to subprogramme 4, Economic analysis, it is recalled that that post was redeployed from subprogramme 4 to subprogramme 3 in the biennium 2000-2001. At that time, it was considered that the post would be needed for work on demographic analysis for the Conference of European Statisticians. Taking into account the development of a new large programme related to population analysis, the Gender and Generation Programme — and the expected follow-up to the ECE Ministerial Conference on Ageing in 2002, ECE considers now that the post needs to be returned to subprogramme 4 to strengthen the work on population analysis in that subprogramme.

Consultants and experts

- A.18.17 A provision of \$38,200, at the maintenance level, is required to cover specialized services to assist in the areas of social indicators and frameworks, monitoring and benchmarking, development of a database with an integrated presentation of international statistical work programmes, for conducting the European Comparison Programme, to prepare a methodological manual on price statistics and to consolidate databases in the field of food and agricultural statistics.

Travel of staff

- A.18.18 Estimated requirements of \$79,000, at the maintenance level, provide for the costs of travel for consultation and participation in meetings with Eurostat, OECD, the Council of Europe, national statistical offices, particularly those of countries with economies in transition, the Administrative Committee on Coordination's Subcommittee on Statistical Activities, and other international organizations, funds, programmes and agencies of the United Nations system.

Supplies and materials

- A.18.19 The requirements of \$3,900, at the maintenance level, relate to the acquisition of special statistical publications and data services produced by national and international statistical services. These materials are required to support statistical research activities.

Grants and contributions

- A.18.20 The reduction of \$383,700 is due to the redeployment of the provision for computer processing, telecommunications, data storage and other specialized information technology services to programme support, where it is administered centrally.

Consultants and experts

- A.18.22 The requirements of \$57,700, at the maintenance level, provide for outside specialized expertise to assist the ECE secretariat in preparing two annual issues of the *Economic Survey of Europe*, in preparing the annual seminar held prior to the session of the Commission, and in preparing for the Ministerial Conference on Ageing. Consultants will be requested to prepare background papers on topics to be determined and agreed upon with ECE member Governments. Reports will deal with specific problems of macroeconomic policies, structural reforms and other subjects for which the required level of expertise is not available in the ECE secretariat. Outside expertise will also be required to assist in drafting the final document of the Conference on Ageing.

Travel of staff

- A.18.23 The requirements of \$34,800, at the maintenance level, relate to consultation missions with national and intergovernmental organizations on substantive issues, coordination in the preparation of publications and cooperation in the area of economic analysis and research.

Contractual services

- A.18.24 The requirements of \$25,200, reflecting a decrease of \$4,300, relate to the printing costs for the *Economic Survey of Europe* (two issues) and the cost of producing issues of the *Survey* from 1948 on CD-ROM, thus allowing researchers and other readers to easily and quickly retrieve specific information on economic developments in the ECE region.

Supplies and materials

- A.18.25 The requirements of \$35,200, at the maintenance level, relate to subscriptions and ad hoc purchases of specialized economic statistics on CD-ROM/diskettes and online access; services available on the web or direct electronic connection; and subscriptions to periodicals and fees for membership in professional societies, for example the Association d'Instituts Européens de Conjoncture Économique (AIECE) and the European Economic Association (EEA).

Grants and contributions

- A.18.26 The reduction of \$79,700 is due to the redeployment of the provision for computer processing, telecommunications, data storage and other specialized information technology services to programme support, where it is administered centrally.

- A.18.32 The provision of \$37,900, at the maintenance level, is needed to cover specialized consultancy services to assist in the development of codes used in the United Nations Electronic Data Interchange for Administration, Commerce and Transport (EDIFACT) and the United Nations Code for Ports and Other Locations (LOCODE); preparation of analysis of the international trade transaction, business process and modelling; the preparation of the ECE guidelines on joint ventures in countries with economies in transition; the preparation of a high-level ministerial meeting on industry and enterprise development to promote the full integration of the countries with economies in transition in the European and world economies; the development of software for the EDIFACT repository and World Wide Web-based database developments; the preparation of a new activity on service sector development in countries with economies in transition; and the development of a repository for business process models.

Travel of staff

- A.18.33 Requirements of \$74,300, at the maintenance level, are needed for consultation and coordination with national and intergovernmental organizations in areas related to trade, industry, and enterprise development, and for meetings with and participation in meetings of the Department of Economic and Social Affairs, OECD, ESCAP, UNCITRAL, the World Bank, the European Commission and others. The integrated programme for trade, industry and enterprise development encompasses many distinct activities. The work in this broad area requires intensive cooperation and coordination with more than 20 relevant international organizations and with many private associations situated throughout the region, and in some cases, across the world. Effective outreach

to support the implementation of global standards for international trade facilitation throughout the region, particularly in countries with economies in transition, likewise require intensive travel.

Contractual services

- A.18.34 The requirements of \$21,500, reflecting a decrease of \$3,700, relate to the cost of external printing of publications under the subprogramme.

Supplies and materials

- A.18.35 The requirements of \$5,500, at the maintenance level, relate to the costs of CD-ROMs, boxes and covers for CD-ROM publications. Proposed publications in CD-ROM format in 2002-2003 would include: EDIFACT directories; Trade Data Element Directories; LOCODE Directory; XML Trade Documents Compendium; explanatory material for ECE Agricultural Quality Standards; Compendium of ECE Standards for Agricultural Produce; and a compendium of material on enterprise development in countries with economies in transition.

Grants and contributions

- A.18.36 The reduction of \$72,700 is due to the redeployment of the provision for computer processing, telecommunications, data storage and other specialized information technology services to programme support, where it is administered centrally.

Consultants and experts

- A.18.38 A provision of \$21,300, at maintenance level, is needed to cover specialized consultancy services to undertake a study on the outlook of the forest sector in countries with economies in transition; to prepare a draft framework for the global forest resource assessment; to develop a market information system (including user survey); to improve the timber web site; to prepare an analysis of the latest forest resource data, including indicators of sustainable forest management, for the Vienna Ministerial Conference on the Protection of Forests in Europe; to prepare alternative scenarios for trade and environmental policy; and to develop a forest products database.

Travel of staff

- A.18.39 Estimated requirements of \$17,700, at the maintenance level, cover the costs of attendance at meetings and consultations with international organizations, such as strategic coordination with FAO, coordination of forest sector statistical activities with other regional organizations and preparation of meetings and workshops in countries with economies in transition.

Contractual services

- A.18.40 The requirements of \$5,600, reflecting a decrease of \$1,000, relate to the cost of external printing of an update of the Temperate and Boreal Forest Resource Assessment for the Ministerial Conference; a study on the European forest sector outlook; country fact sheets; a publication on trade and environment issues in the forest sector; and a report on promoting the sustainable use of wood as an environmentally friendly raw material.

Grants and contributions

- A.18.41 The reduction of \$11,800 is due to the redeployment of the provision for computer processing, telecommunications, data storage and other specialized information technology services to programme support, where it is administered centrally.

- A.18.46 The staffing requirements of \$2,813,600, at the maintenance level, provide for the posts shown in table A.18.26.

Other staff costs

- A.18.47 A provision of \$152,400, reflecting no growth, includes, for the whole of ECE, \$114,700 for general temporary assistance to replace staff on extended sick leave and maternity leave and for temporary assistance during peak workload periods and \$37,700 for overtime during periods of heavy workload, in particular during the sessions of the Commission and during the preparation for the sessions of its principal subsidiary bodies.

Travel of staff

- A.18.48 The provision of \$41,900, reflecting no growth, covers the requirements of the Executive Office for consultations with Headquarters and participation in meetings on administration, personnel and budget and financial matters, and the requirements of the Coordinating Unit staff to oversee operational activities related, in particular, to countries with economies in transition; to consult with national authorities in these countries on the preparation of operational projects; to participate in and service seminars and workshops in these countries; as well as to consult with other United Nations programmes and specialized agencies, member countries of the European Union and other international bodies.

Contractual services

- A.18.49 The requirements of \$100,000 for data-processing services, reflecting a decrease of \$17,200, are required for the upgrading of software licences and LAN support.

General operating expenses

- A.18.50 The requirements of \$108,900, reflecting no growth, relate to rental of equipment (\$13,400); maintenance of data-processing and automated equipment, such as photocopy and fax machines (\$87,400); and miscellaneous services (\$8,100), including freight, mailing and transportation charges.

Supplies and materials

- A.18.51 The requirements of \$72,900, at the maintenance level, relate to stationery and other expendable office supplies, data-processing supplies and materials and library books and supplies.

Furniture and equipment

- A.18.52 The provision of \$396,900, reflecting no growth, is for the acquisition of electronic data-processing (\$329,100) and office automation equipment (\$24,200); replacement of office automation equipment and software (\$43,600).

Grants and contributions

- A.18.53 The new provision of \$1,123,200 covers requirements for the computer processing, telecommunications, data storage and other specialized information technology services provided for the whole of ECE. Provision for such services was shown in the previous biennium under each subprogramme. The consolidation of these provisions under the Executive Office is in line with the central allocation and administration under this Office of other expenditures common to ECE, for example, general temporary assistance, office supplies and materials and acquisition of furniture and equipment. The resources include an increase of \$430,200 to strengthen the ECE information technology platform and enable ECE to sustain the requirements of its substantive subprogrammes. ECE intends to outsource some non-strategic information technology services in 2002-2003. Criteria for the eventual choice of services will take into account the qualifications and capacity of the ECE Information Service Unit and the quality and price of service delivery by the service provider.
