**Qatar rejects and condemns the abduction of innocent people**

Qatar has rejected and condemned the practice of abducting and mistreating innocent people — for any reason whatever — as incompatible with morality and humanitarian principles. In a statement to the Qatar News Agency on Saturday, 2 February 2002, an official spokesman for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs expressed condemnation of this practice, especially the targeting of journalists and other media representatives performing their professional duties. He expressed concern and regret at the recent detention of a correspondent for the *Wall Street Journal* and voiced the hope that he would be released as soon as possible.
