# Capacity building workshops to review project outcomes and design implementation strategies

Summary of Agenda

Geneva, 17 – 21 November 2014 (draft 14/10/2014)

The <u>DPAD/CDP Unit</u> is organizing a number of meetings in Geneva to discuss the findings of recent project activities and plan for implementation.

On **17 November**, interim project results achieved in the Gambia and Uganda will be presented and discussed. This meeting also allows the recently added pilot countries, Lesotho and Nepal, an opportunity to learn from experiences of their counterparts in Gambia and Uganda.

The project results have identified the need for building institutional capacity to improve information sharing between the public and private sector on SPS and TBT related notifications and impediments to trade. The establishment of an electronic platform should assist private sector stakeholders in the pilot countries to access information on new and changing export requirements related to SPS and TBT measures introduced by trading partners.

Activities on **18 November** will focus on discussing project findings and experiences from the four pilot countries in public/private communications related to TBT and SPS notifications and information.

On **18 November** the project results will also be presented to the LDC Group and development partners at the WTO.

On **19 November** the participants will discuss experiences from development partners in assisting the pilot countries and other LDCs with overcoming institutional capacity constraints related to public/private sector information sharing and establishing electronic tools for addressing the lack of private sector access to TBT and SPS-related information.
