ECOSOC adopted resolution E/RES/2015/L.13 on the Report of the Committee for Development Policy on its seventeenth session, acknowledging the contributions made by the CDP to the various aspects of the programme of work of the Council.

CDP Background paper #25, Transitioning from the MDGs to the SDGs: Accountability for the Post-2015 Era

The CDP Subgroup on Accountability argues that while sustainable development goals are universal in character, they need to be adapted to national contexts, according to specific sets of constraints and opportunities. To strengthen current accountability system for development, CDP recommends, among other things, that specific responsibilities could be assigned to subsidiary bodies of ECOSOC, and other bodies of UN system.
