




#### Who is a Refugee?



 Refugees are forced to flee their countries because of armed conflict, serious disturbances of public order or persecution/denial of their human rights.

They do not enjoy the protection of their

home country

Other groups protected/assisted



#### **UNHCR's Role**



- Providing International Protection to Refugees
- Finding solutions to refugee problems
  - Voluntary Repatriation
  - Local Integration
  - Resettlement

## Challenges Ahead : Forced Migration and Migration/Development



- Mixed movements
- Safe and Legal mechanisms for movements
- Prevention of forced displaced

### Challenges in Asia-Pacific: Identifying/Protecting Refugees in Mixed Movements

- Forced displacement mixed with broader movements
- Low accession rate to refugee instruments
- National refugee protection structures scarce
- UNHCR often main actor for protection
- Hostile environment encourages onward movement
- Civil Society often focuses on citizens' rights





### Challenges in the Asia-Pacific: Safe and Legal Movement



- Labour sending and Labour receiving countries present
- Governments often focus on migration control
- Tradition of bilateralism

## Challenges in the Asia-Pacific: Prevention of forced displacement



- Major refugee producing countries:
- Myanmar
- Sri Lanka
- DPRK: North Korea

- Differentiated processes and procedures
- Solutions for refugees
- Addressing secondary movements
- Return arrangements for non-refugees and alternative migration options
- Information strategy
