Illustrative list of indicators

1. Remittances spent on transfer costs
2. Victims of human trafficking per 100,000 people
3. Recruitment costs borne by employee
4. Refugees and IDPs who found a durable solution
5. Human Mobility Index (to be developed), e.g.:
 - migration policies
 - portability
 - fatalities
 - bilateral agreements
 - regularization
 - access to services

Disaggregation

- a. Disaggregate targets relevant for access of international migrants to services (health, education, work, etc.)
- b. "migratory status": nativity status (native-born/foreign-born); citizenship status (citizen, foreigner, stateless), and legal status (regular/irregular) (17.18)

Other potential indicators

6. Expatriation rate of health workers from developing countries in OECD countries (3.c)
7. Outbound mobility ratio of tertiary students born in developing countries (4.b)
8. % migrant workers who benefit from portability of social security rights (8.8)
9. % migrant workers who benefit from recognition of skills and qualifications (8.8)
10. % IM benefiting from financial inclusion (10.c)
