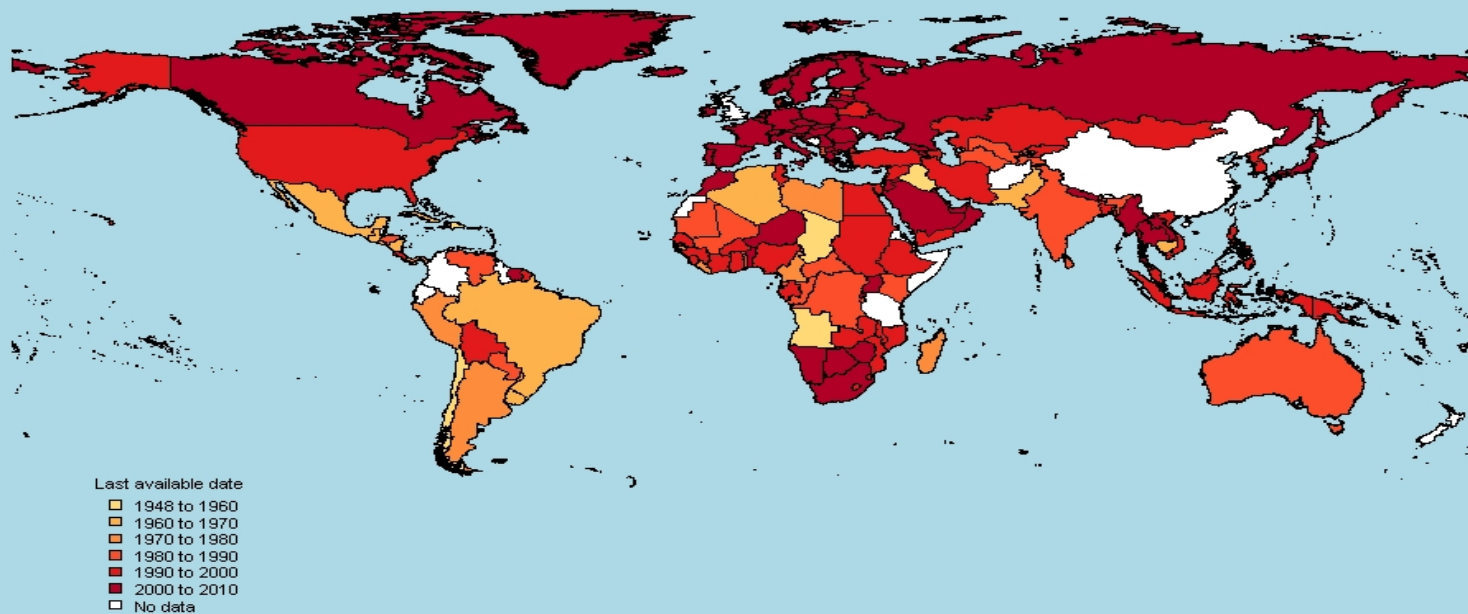

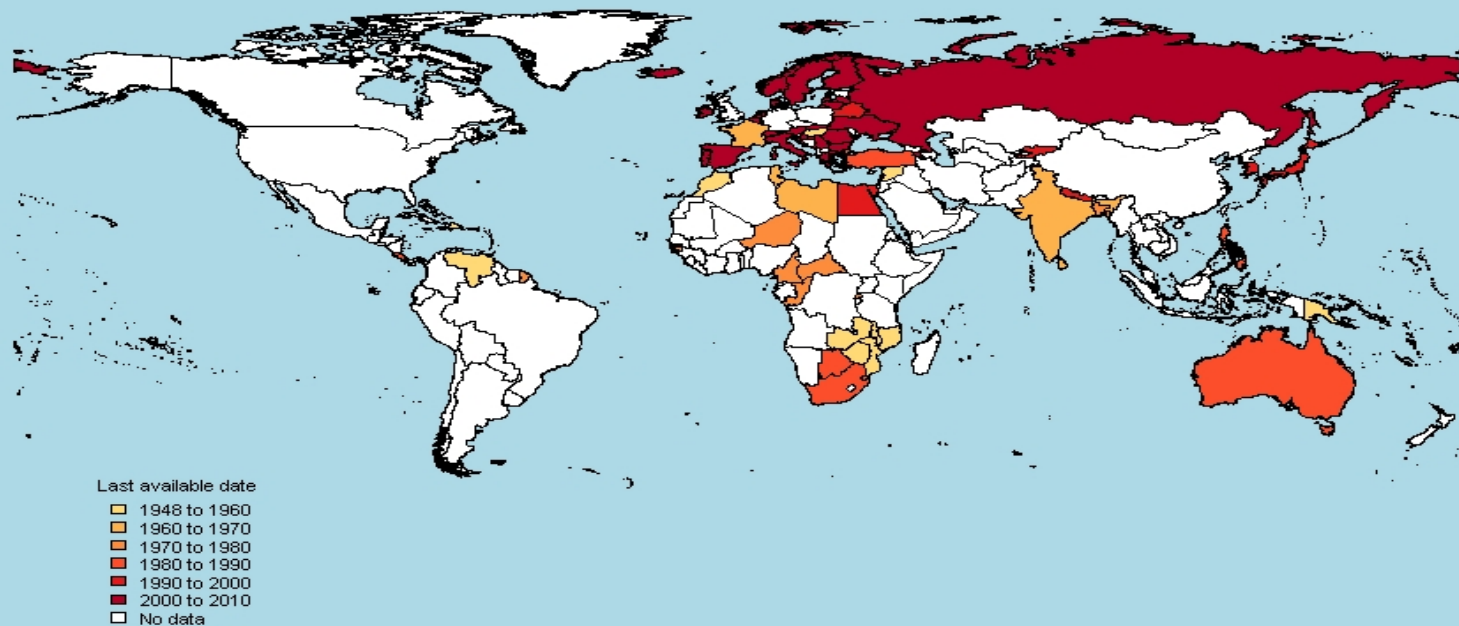
Stateless population (1): Potential data coverage

Stateless population (2): Actual data coverage

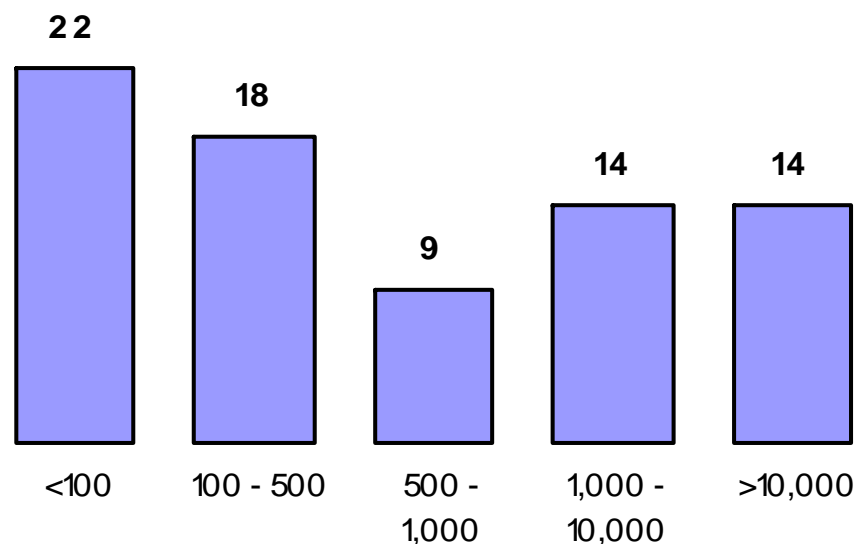
Countries reporting number of stateless persons



Stateless population (3): Absolute and relative size

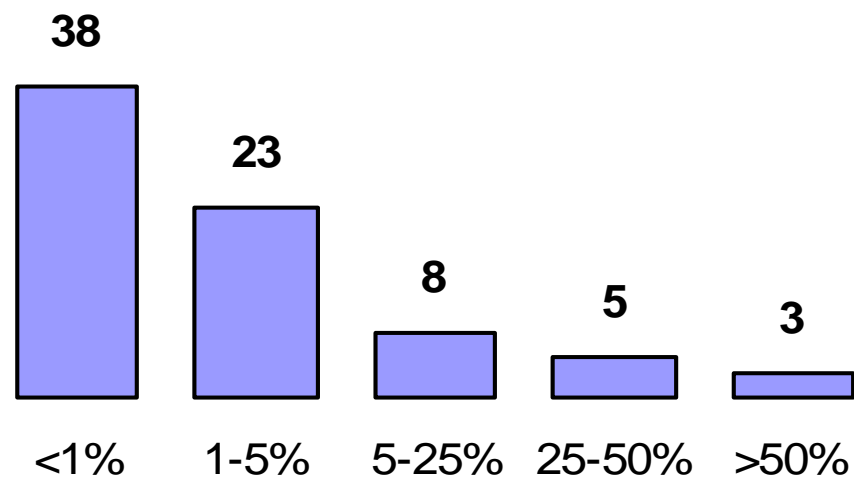
Size of stateless population

(No. of countries = 77)



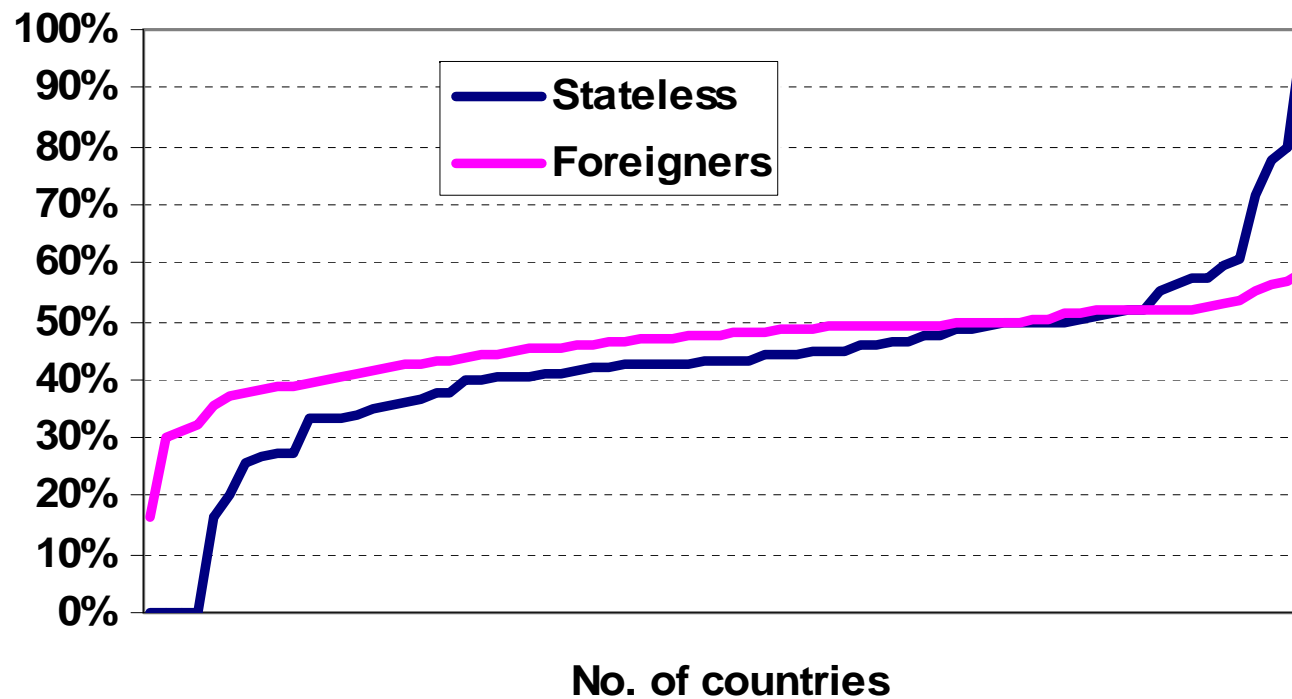
Percentage of stateless population in total of stateless and foreign population

(No. of countries = 77)



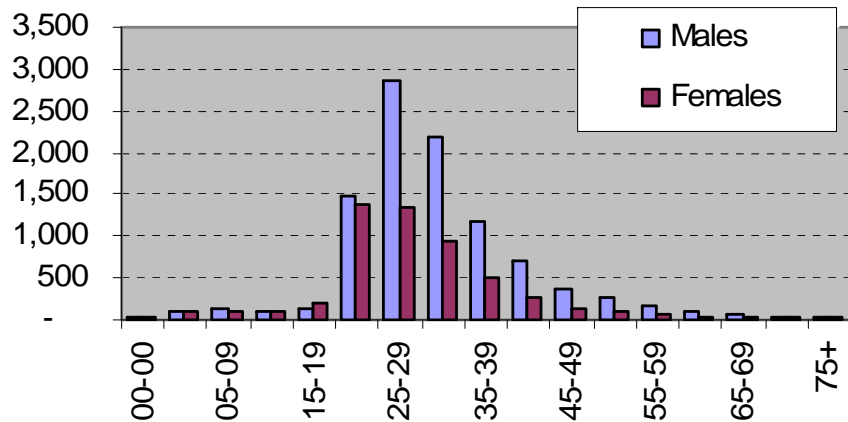
Stateless population (4): Percentage of females

(n = 74)

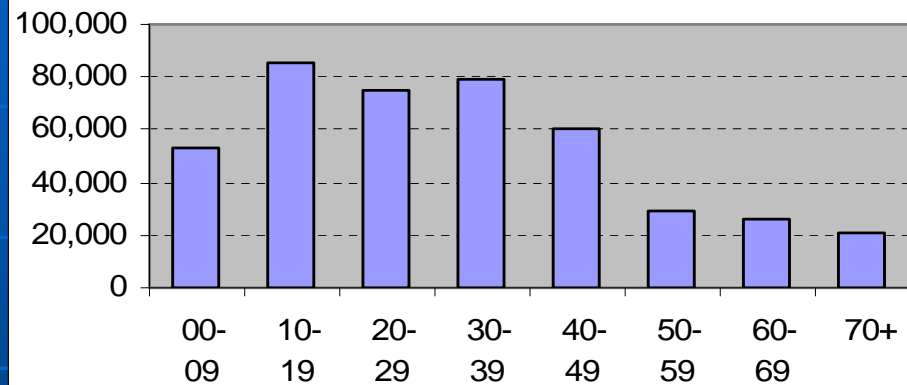


Stateless population (5): Distribution by sex and age

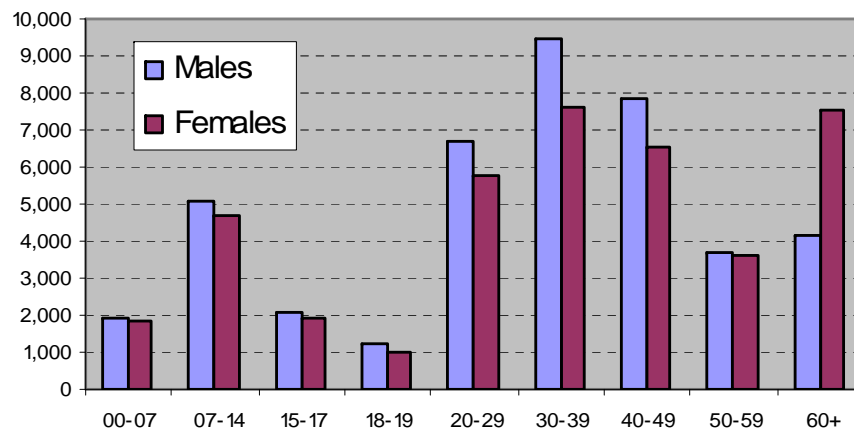
Rep. of Korea, 2000



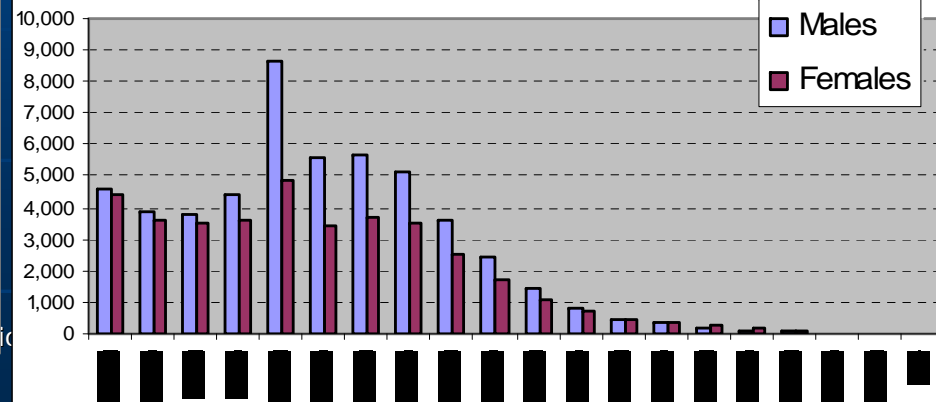
Russian Federation, 2002



Ukraine, 2001

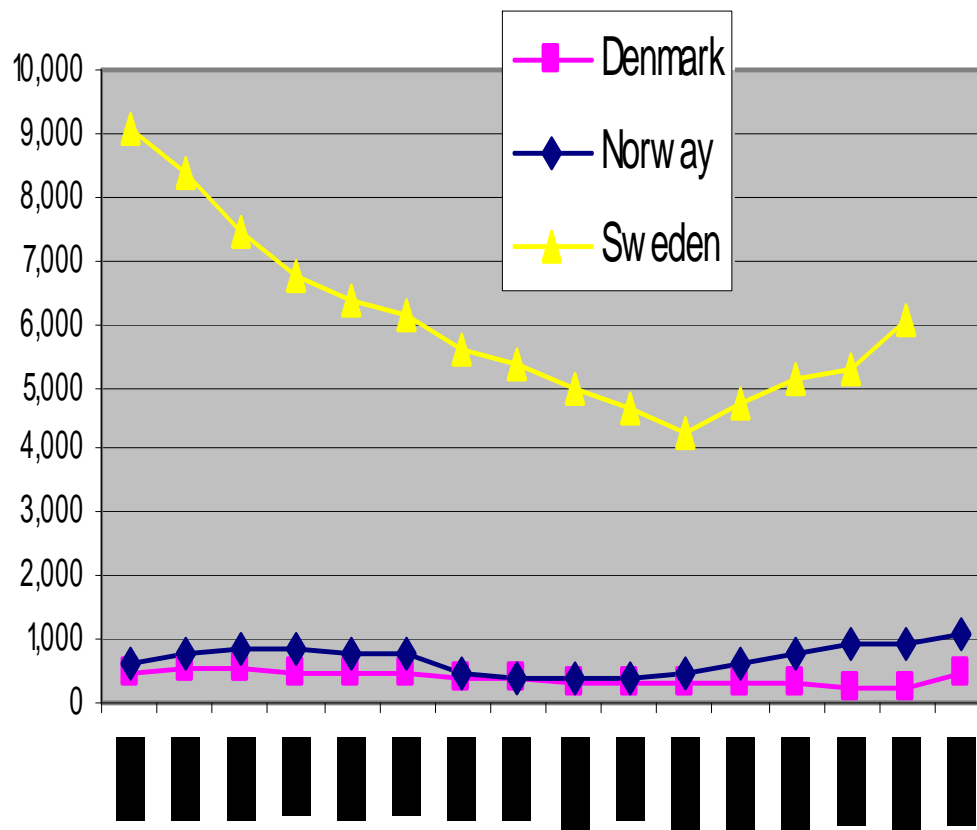

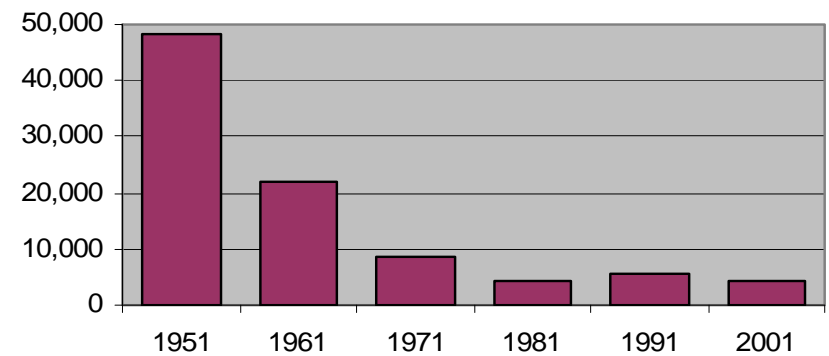

 - *"For the purpose of preparing tabulations on citizenship, all countries should be shown separately to the extent possible and a category of stateless persons should be presented"* (p. 127).
