# (1) First session of the Population Commission, Lake Success, New York, February 1947


“Nearly every branch of the Organization and of the specialized agencies requires *prompt and reliable information* on the *number and characteristics of people* in different parts of the world and on the *manner in which their numbers are changing by birth, death and migration*. We need accurate *human accounting*.”

# A/RES/65/170 – international migration and development

## § OP 21


“Calls upon the United Nations system and their relevant international organizations and multilateral institutions to enhance their cooperation in the *promotion and development of methodologies for the collection and processing of internationally comparable statistical data* on international migration and the situation of migrants in countries of origin, transit and destination, and to *assist Member States in their capacity-building* efforts in this regard.”




as South-North migration



# Compared to the total population, the young are underrepresented among international migrants ...




... while those of working age and over age 65 are overrepresented




# ... while they are older in Latin America and Europe







# The impact of the financial crisis: net migration of foreigners





# The role of South - North migration in immigration flows






# Young people represent a major proportion of those migrating annually

# Differential impact of international migration on population change



# Global Forum on Migration and Development

## Origin

- Emerged from the 2006 High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development

## Objective

- to advance understanding and cooperation on the nexus between migration and development
- to foster practical and action-oriented outcomes

## Character

- voluntary, informal, participatory, non-binding and Government-led process

## (3) Interagency coordination (A/RES/58/208)



- **Participants: UNDESA, GMG, UN Secretariat, NGOs, Member States** – about 100 participants
- **Chairs of the Global Forum on Migration and Development**

**10th Coordination Meeting:  
9-10 February 2012**

- **Topics:** data, remittances, human trafficking, labour migration, migration of the highly-skilled, financial crisis, capacity-building and knowledge sharing, migrant integration, etc.

# Global Migration Group



- Created by United Nations Secretary-General in context of the **2006 High Level Dialogue**
- 16 members, including the 14 United Nations entities, IOM and the World Bank, **UNDESA member since 2006**
- **Objectives:**
  - Apply international instruments and norms on international migration
  - Promote coherent, comprehensive and coordinated approach to international migration

# (4) Development Account Project on strengthening national capacities to deal with international migration (Regional Commissions and UNDESA)

## Objectives

- Provide tools for countries to take advantage of migration benefits
- Strengthen national institutional capacities to incorporate international migration into national development strategies
- Improve quality and availability of information
- Promote cooperation through an intra and interregional network

## Outcome

- 6 regional and 2 interregional workshops
- Inventory on information systems on international migration (UNECE and ECLAC have web-based inventory)
- Final outcome report (forthcoming)
- Toolkit (forthcoming)

# Five steps to improve migration data in the long term, with existing institutions and at low cost are ...

**Ask** basic census questions – country of birth, citizenship, previous residence by age and sex – and tabulate and disseminate the answers

**Make** better use of existing administrative data sources

**Compile** existing data from surveys

**Provide** access to micro data

**Build** capacity to collect and disseminate data
