

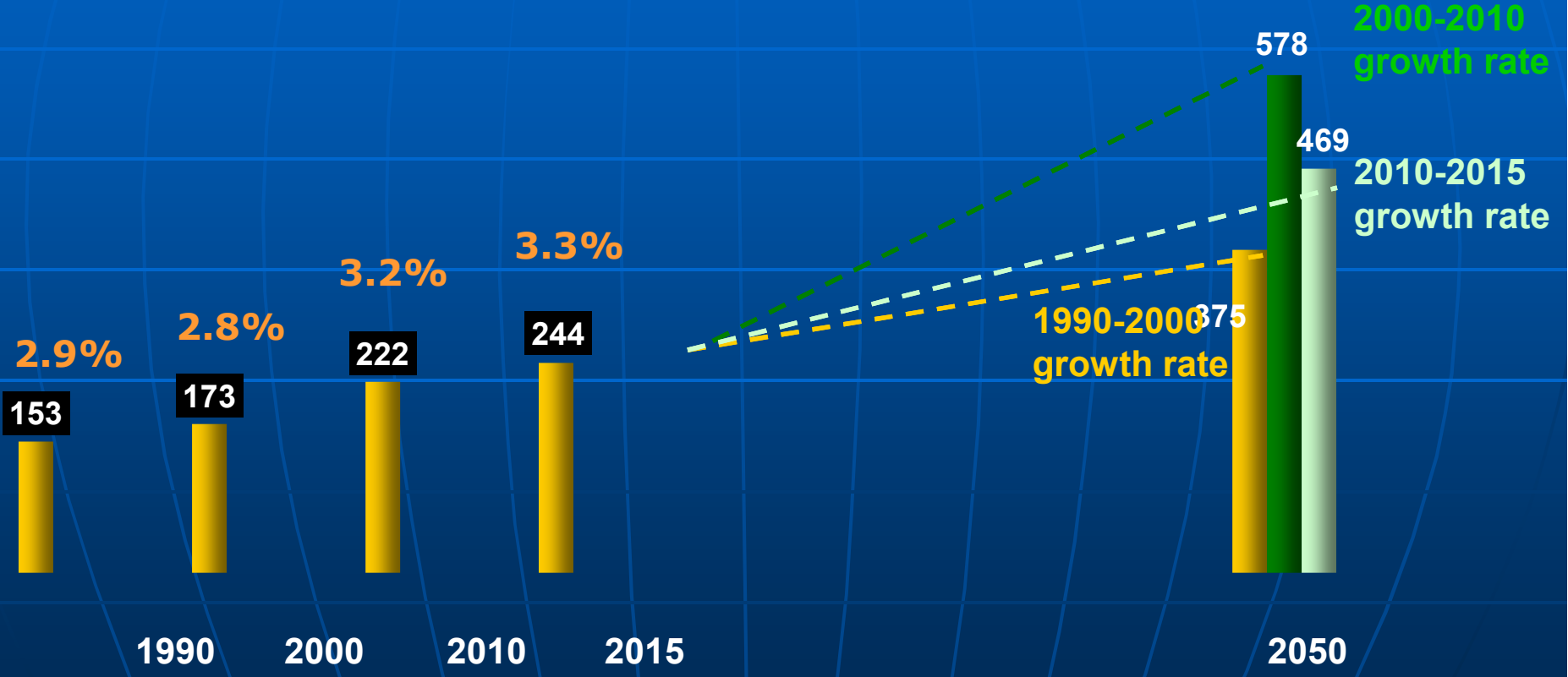
# Who is an international migrant?

(United Nations, Department of Economic and Social Affairs, Statistics Division (1998). Recommendation on statistics of international migration. Rev.1.)

- Any person who changes her / his country of residence
  - Part of this definition:
    - a move
    - minimum duration of stay
  - Not part of this definition:
    - purpose / reason
    - migratory / legal status
  - Main data source: population census
    - Foreign-born (country of birth)
    - Foreign citizen (citizenship)

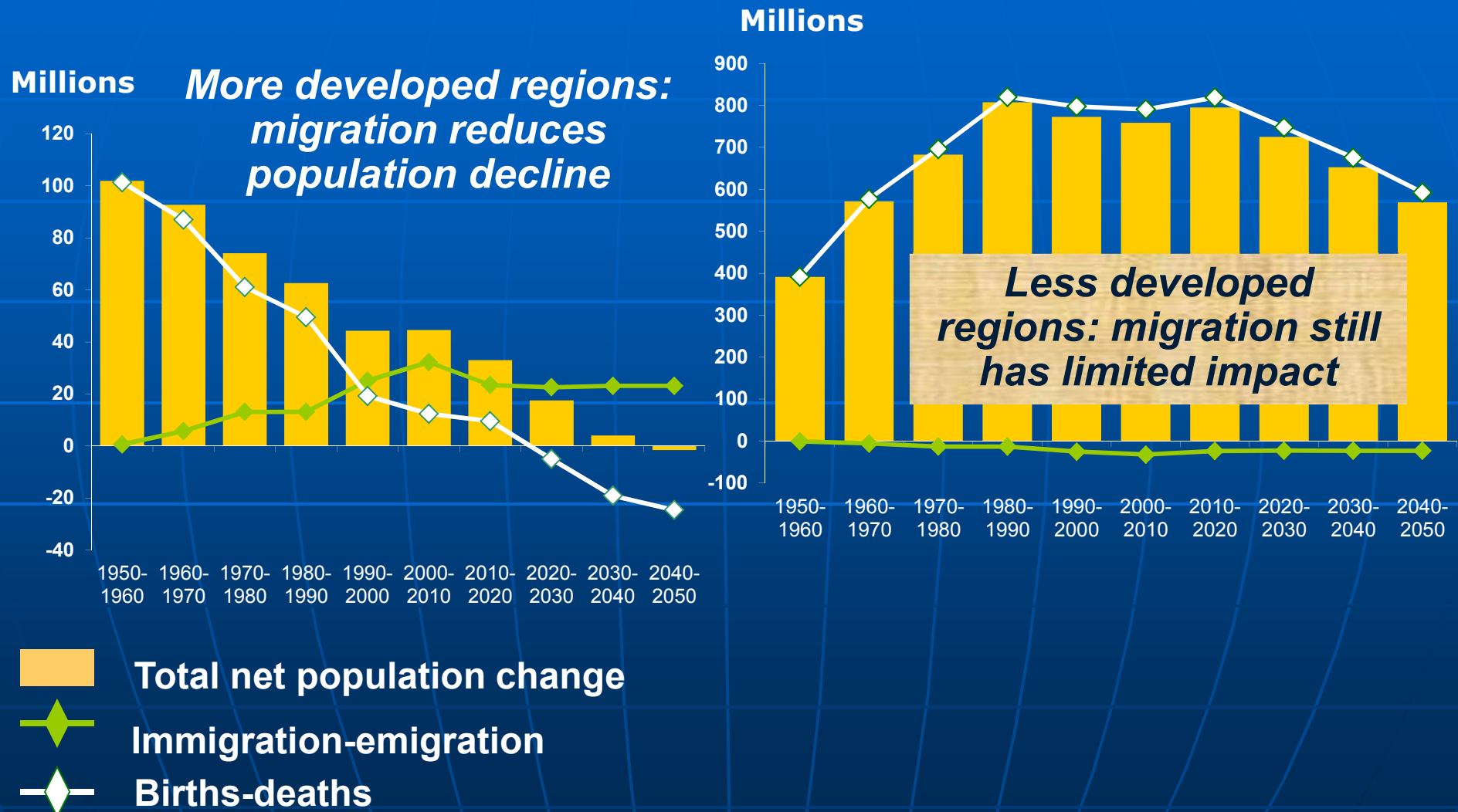
# 1. The number of international migrants is likely to increase

Proportion of international migrants in total population



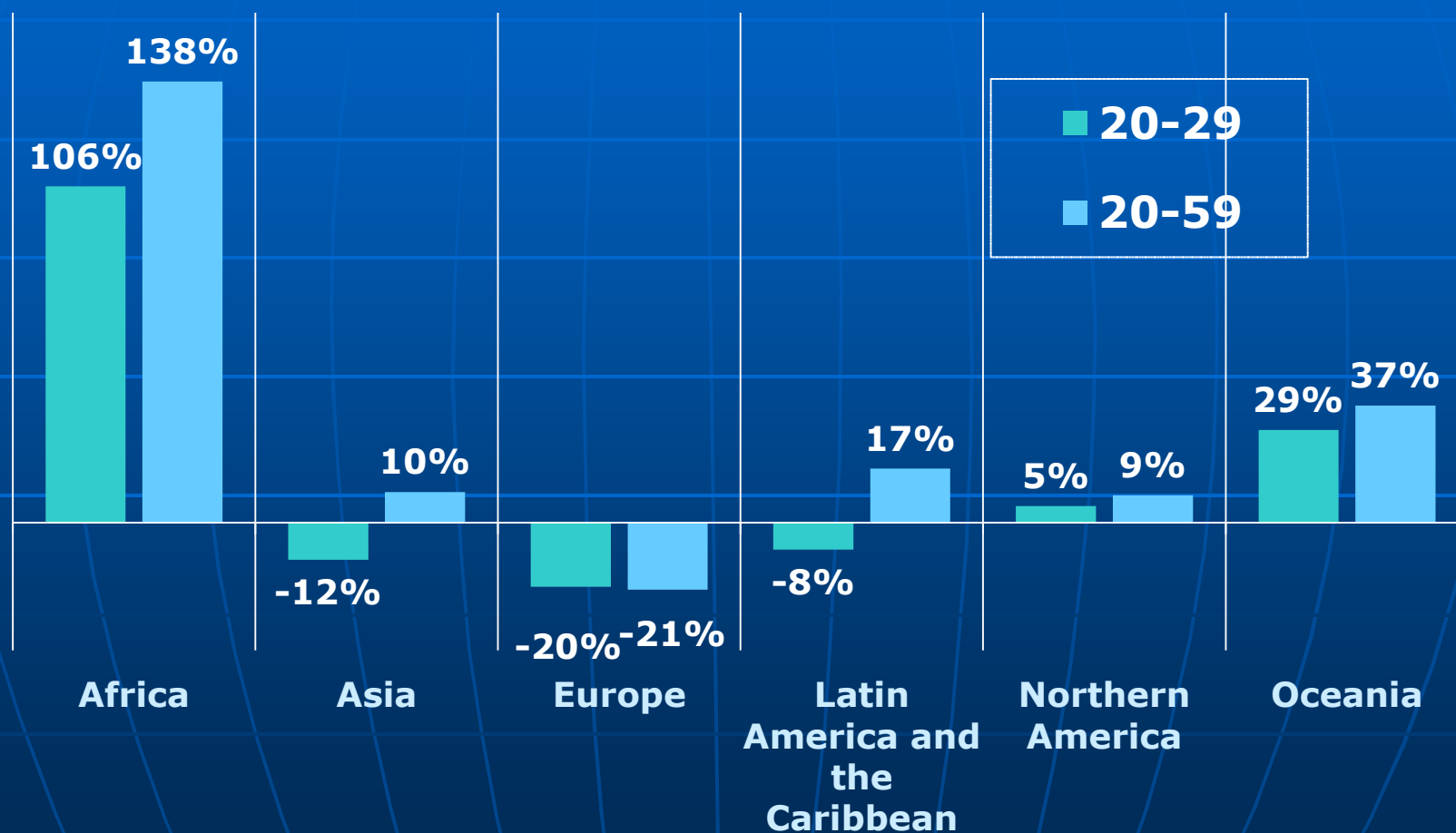

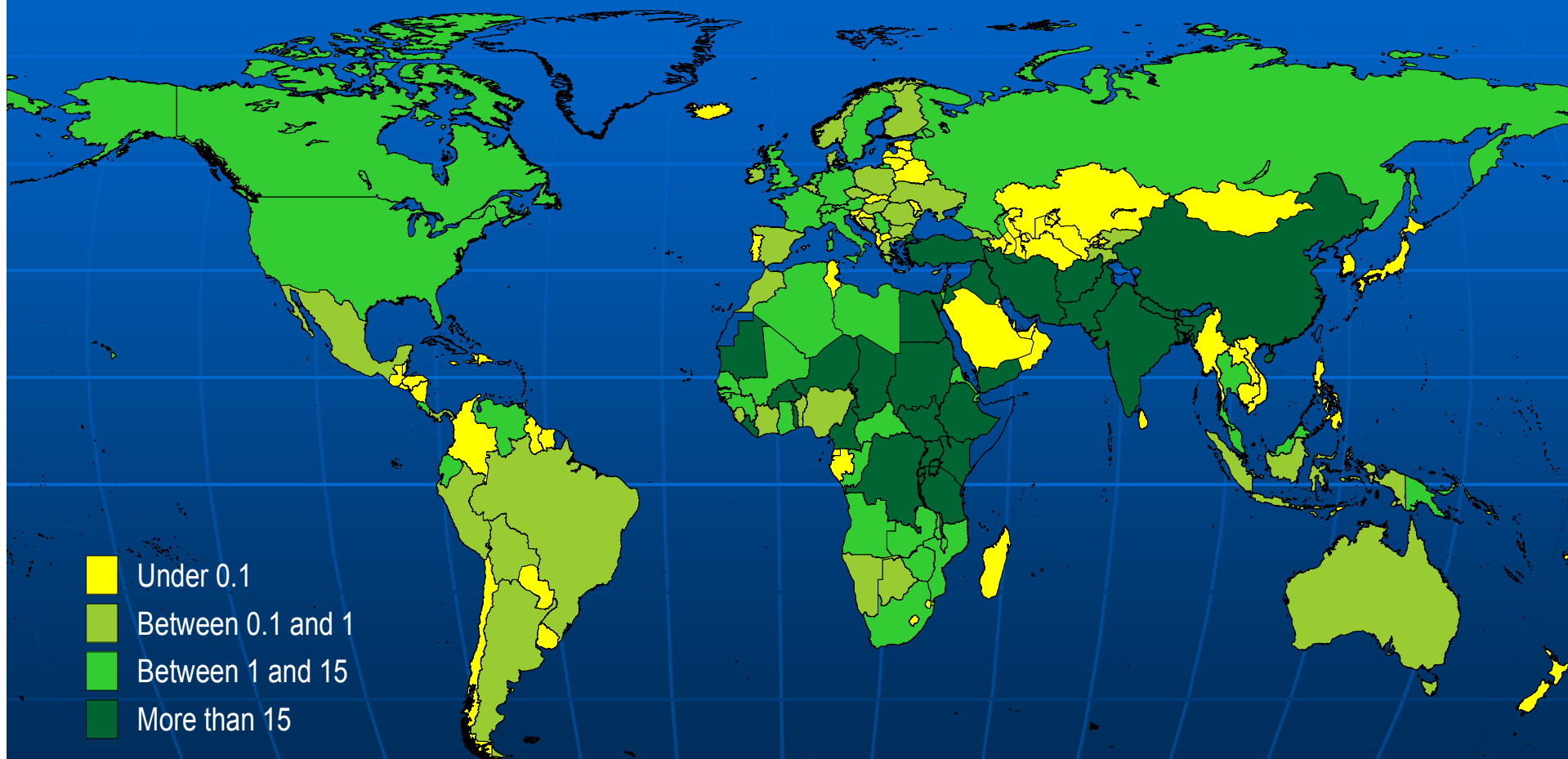
### 3. Regional differences in the change of the working age (20-59) and youth (20-29) population will be significant (2015 – 2050)

## 4. Responsibility sharing for refugees is uneven

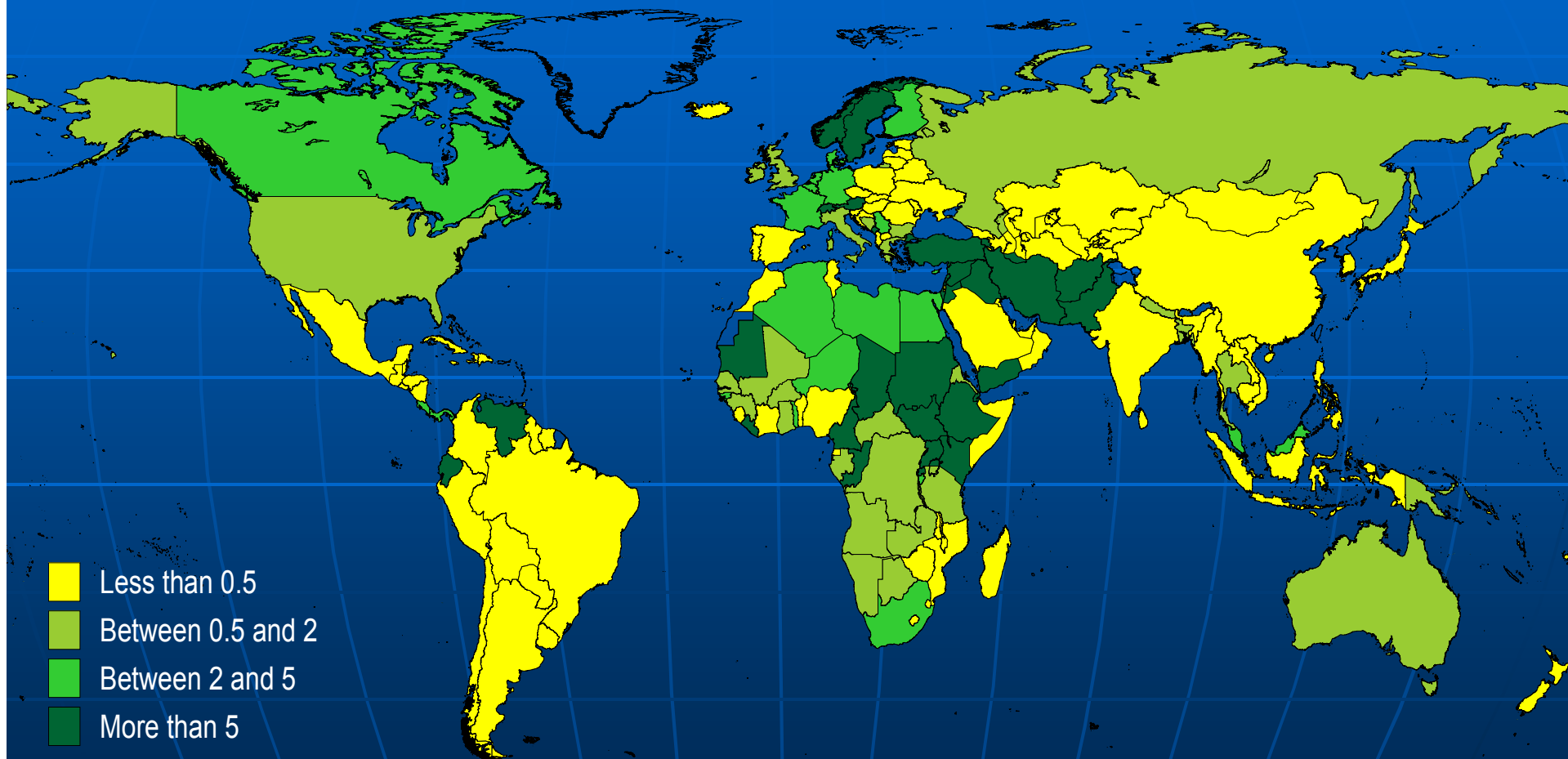
Ratio of refugee population to gross domestic product per capita (*PPPs*)
