




Recent methodological work on migration statistics



- Circular migration
 - Growing policy importance: Task Force established February 2013
 - Propose a common international statistical definition of circular migration
 - Case studies by Italy and Sweden show the possibilities and challenges in collecting these data





Two statistical definitions for Circular Migration



- General statistical definition:
 - A circular migrant is a person who has crossed the national borders of the reporting country at least 3 times over a 10-year period, each time with duration of stay (abroad or in the country) of at least 12 months.
- Extended statistical definition allowing for short-term migrations:
 - A circular migrant is a person who has crossed the national borders of the reporting country at least 3 times over a 10-year period, each time with duration of stay (abroad or in the country) of at least 90 days.
- Approved by CES Bureau on 12 October
