## UNITED NATIONS ELEVENTH INQUIRY AMONG GOVERNMENTS ON POPULATION AND DEVELOPMENT









### The Inquiry

- Mandated by the General Assembly in 1962
- First Inquiry conducted in 1963
- Conducted on behalf of the Secretary-General, through the UN Permanent Missions of Member States in NY
- The scope of the inquiries has changed over time, with changing policy priorities in the world
- Eleventh Inquiry (May 2014) is divided into three modules:
  - I. Population Size, Growth and Distribution
  - II. Fertility, Family Planning and Reproductive Health
  - III. International Migration
- Greater emphasis on programme measures
- The Inquiry responses on policy variables are codified into the World Population Policies Database

### The six proposed domains – possible questions

- 1. Institutional capacity and policy Is there at least one dedicated government entity responsible for designing and implementing overall migration policy?
- 2. Migrant rights Does the government promote the integration of immigrants through language skills training, equal access to public services, and protection against discrimination?
- **3. Safe and orderly migration** Does the Government address irregular migration through pre-arrival authorization controls, integrated border management or other measures to ensure safe and orderly migration?

#### The six proposed domains – possible questions

- 4. Labour migration and recruitment costs Does the government take steps to reduce recruitment costs, born by the employee as percentage of yearly income earned in country of destination? How many bilateral and regional agreements has the country subscribed to facilitate labour migration?
- 5. International partnerships Has the country signed bilateral labour agreements concerning the movement of workers?
- 6. Humanitarian crises and migration policy Does the government's humanitarian policy include measures in relation to forced displacement of persons?
