Amy Tsui is Professor and Director of the Bill and Melinda Gates Institute for Population and Reproductive Health, Johns Hopkins University Bloomberg School of Public Health. Her research interests include family planning, fertility, and related health issues in developing countries. Her current research is on the effects of various family planning and health service delivery models on contraceptive, fertility, and sexual health outcomes in sub-Saharan African and other low-income countries. She has published extensively over the last three decades on topics ranging from survey design to maternal health, with the bulk of her published works being on contraceptive use and fertility in developing countries. Amy Tsui has been a member of numerous advisory boards and editorial committees and is frequently invited to participate in panels and make presentations. In 2010 she was awarded the Carl S. Schulz Lifetime Achievement Award from the American Public Health Association. She has a PhD from the University of Chicago.
