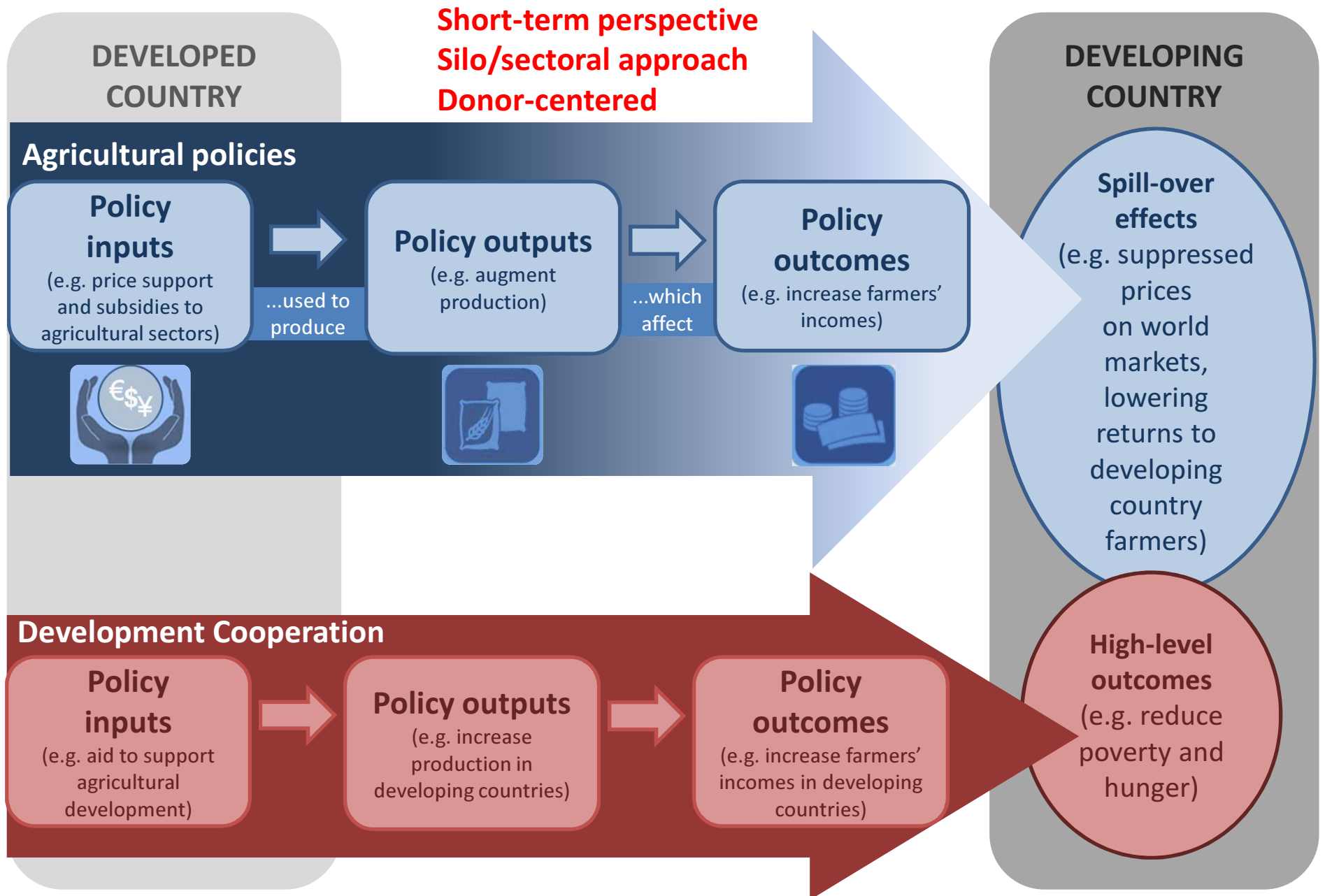

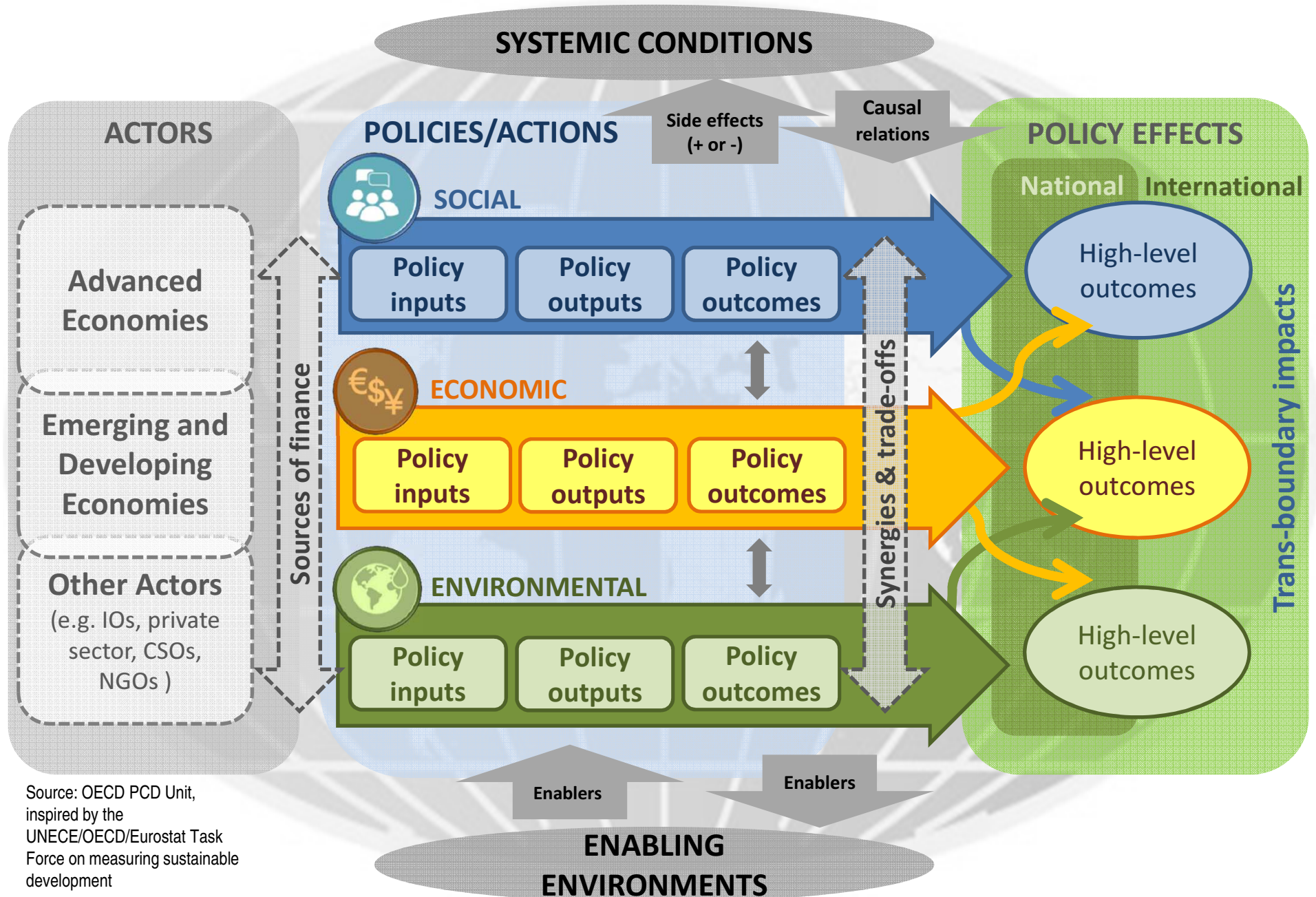

# The limitations of the “do no harm” approach to PCD

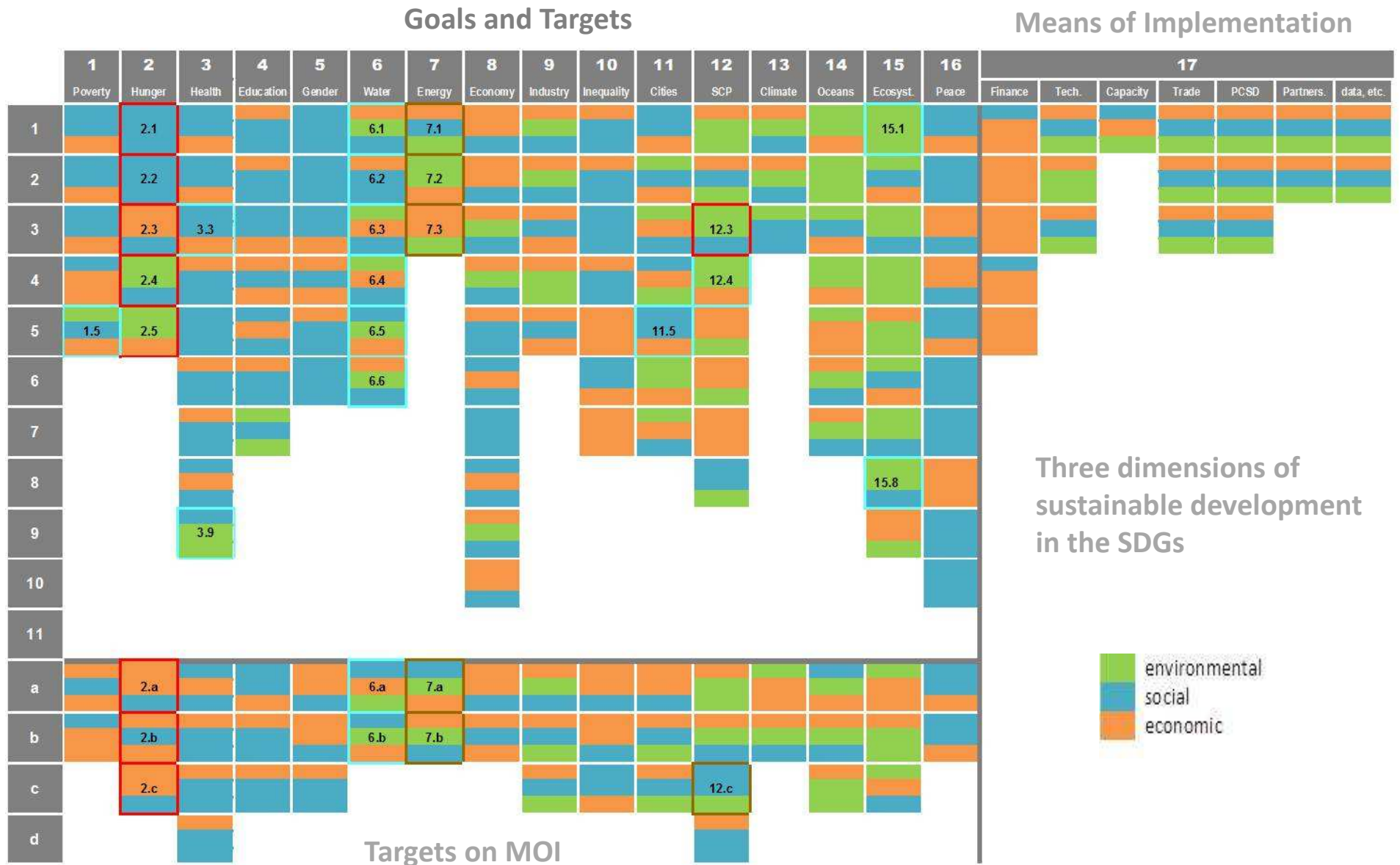


# A new framework for PCSD

# The water-energy-food nexus in the SDGs



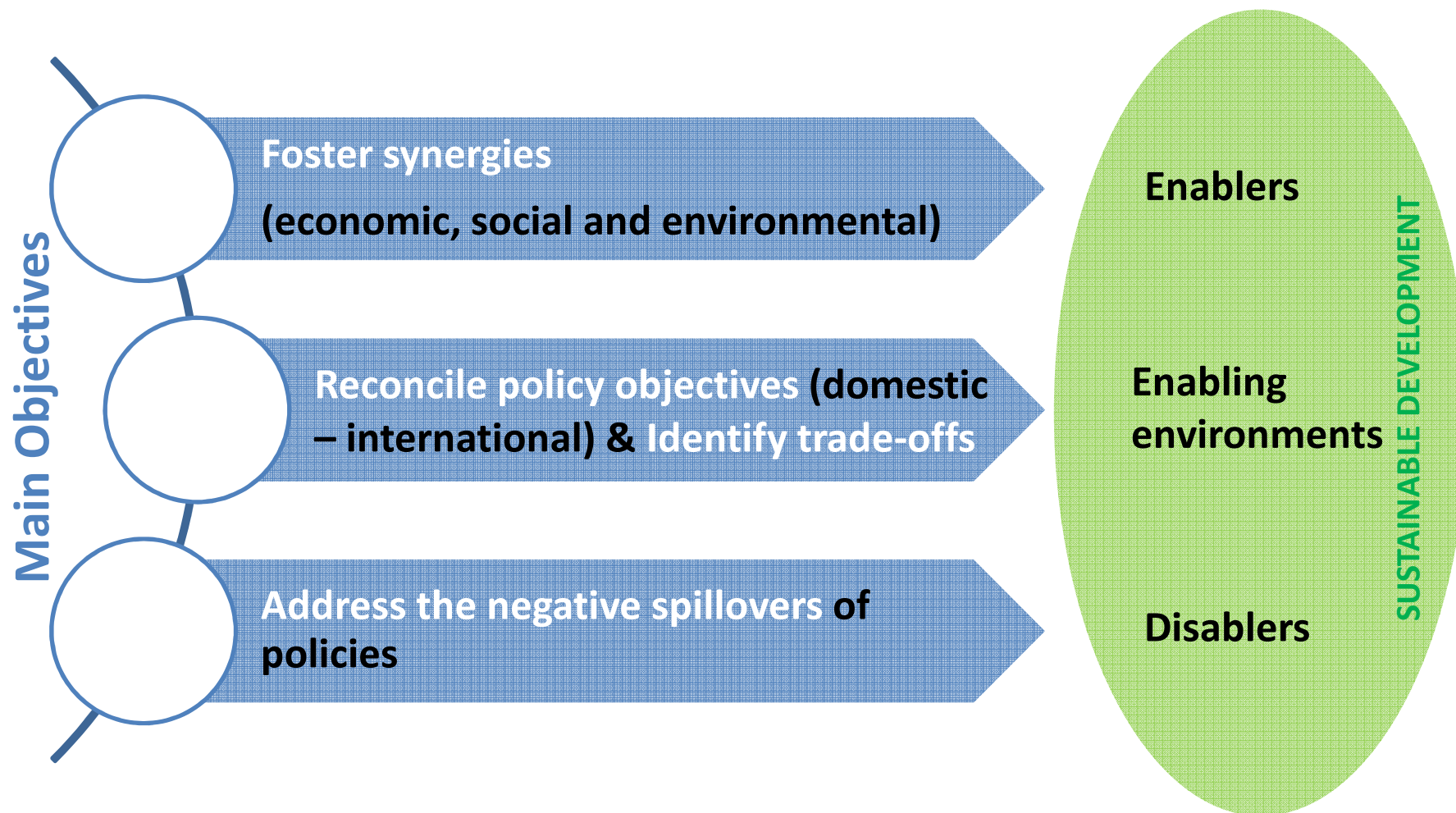

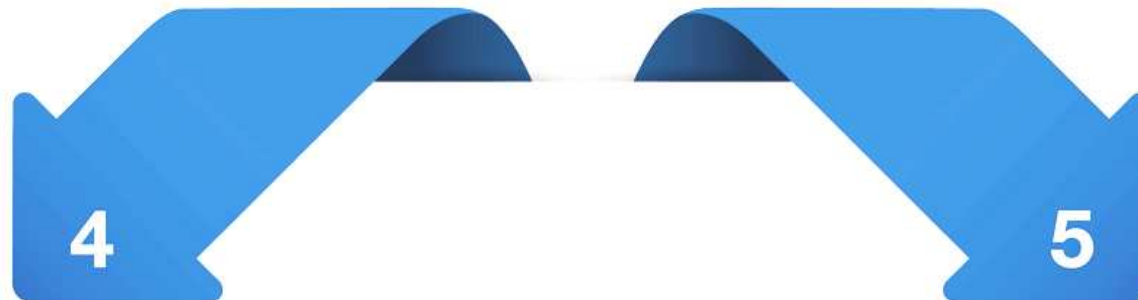
