- What should humanitarian coordination and urban response strategy look like within a protracted and sudden onset urban crisis?
- What role can be played by the private sector?
- How do we adapt refugee responses to urban setting, hosting cities and communities?
- What funding instruments do we need to respond to these challenges?
- What should our next steps be collectively?
