The road leading to Busan

Shifting landscape for global development:

- Significant shifts in wealth
- Poverty and inequality persist within countries
- Increasingly complex global relations, strong interdependence between countries and regions
- Broad variety of resources available to enhance development
- → HLF4 reflected and addressed these changes



Why Busan was a success

- Busan more than previous high-level fora demonstrated that developing countries can and should lead in setting the development agenda
- 2. Evidence-based process confirming the relevance of Paris principles and supporting international accountability
- Whole-of-government forum ensuring high-level commitment for a global and forward-looking agenda
- 4. An **inclusive agreement** underpinned by transparent negotiations
- 5. Complementary, voluntary initiatives to reach common goals



The way forward: Building on the HLF4 success

OECD Development Assistance Committee

- Identifying key areas for leadership for DAC members
 - Efforts to until aid
 - Analysis on aid allocations (future spending plans, under-aided countries)
 - Support to state-building and effective institutions
 - Further analysis on development finance

Partnering for progress

- Linking OECD-wide development efforts to the Global Partnership
 - OECD Development Strategy
 - DAC Global Relations Strategy
