We have come to the end of another exciting Youth Forum.

I would like to thank all panelists for their comments and thoughtful reflection throughout this highly productive two-day event.

I thank you all for participating; this fourth annual ECOSOC Youth Forum has exceeded expectations because of your presence. What have we achieved over the past two days?

- We have raised awareness of the importance of youth's voice in shaping the post-2015 development agenda.
- We have put on a youth lens to address the multiple challenges young people are facing, especially in Africa. We have highlighted the continued importance of the implementation of the World Programme of Action for Youth and its links to the Post 2015 development agenda.

As we fast approach the Council's own High-level Segment in July, I have no doubt that our work today will be an important contribution. Recommended actions and key messages of this event will be presented at that meeting.

Last year, as I closed the ECOSOC Youth Forum of 2014, I expressed the need for the Forum to become the platform through which the views of young people could be brought in the post 2015 development agenda. Reflecting on these last two days, I can confidently say that we have achieved this.

Our challenge now, dear young colleagues, is to continue these efforts well beyond 2015, with the same enthusiasm we have seen during these two days. Join the Children and Youth Major Group, if you are not yet a member. This would allow you to engage more directly in the UN's work.
