KEY POINTS of the statement

- O At the UN Summit in 2005 the President of Belarus proposed to recognise the **diversity of ways to progress** as a value of civilisational magnitude.
- O Diversity and respect for diversity are intrinsic elements of the human civilisation. No meaningful dialogue, especially interfaith and intercultural dialogue, can happen without the understanding and sincere respect for diverse political, economic and social ways of self-organisation of human societies stemming from their history, traditions and beliefs.
- O Historically, interreligious and interethnic tolerance, dialogue and cooperation have been indispensable elements of social life in Belarus.

Belarus is a home for 3000 religious organisations representing 25 religions and denominations. Around 20 percent of Belarusian citizens are not ethnic Belarusians. Around 2/3 of Belarusians have relatives of other nationalities.

- O UN should take **more decisive measures** to encourage interreligious, intercultural and interethnic dialogue. We welcome annual meetings on these issues in the UN. They are a good forum for sharing national experiences and best practices.
- O Substantive dialogue and better understanding among nations could be facilitated by enhancing the role of **education** in preventing intolerance, wider use of **new IT technologies** in promoting interreligious and interethnic dialogue, especially among youth, encouraging stricter self-discipline and moral and ethical responsibility of the **media**, intensified **academic exchanges**.
