

## **Financial situation of the United Nations**

## Statement by Yukio Takasu, Under-Secretary-General for Management

## Fifth Committee of the General Assembly at its 71<sup>st</sup> session

## 11 May 2017

Madam Chair, I would like to update the Committee on some developments since you were briefed last week on the UN financial situation.

Since the cut-off date of 30 April, we received a total of \$170 million from 23 Member States. We received \$108 million for the regular budget from 10 Member States. For peacekeeping operations, we received \$54 million from 14 Member States. For the tribunals, we received a total of \$8 million from 7 Member States.

Some of these payments result in additions to the lists of Member States which are fully paid for the various categories.

- For the <u>regular budget</u>, Chile, Italy, Kenya and Micronesia have paid in full, which brings us to a total of 96 Member States.
- For <u>peacekeeping operations</u>, Armenia, Italy and Kenya have paid all peacekeeping assessments currently due, which brings us to a total of 51 Member States.
- For the <u>tribunals</u>, Italy, Kenya, Malaysia, Micronesia and Norway became fully paid – which brings the tribunals total to 69 Member States.

In addition, as indicated in paragraph 27 of the report (A/71/440.Add 1) which is now before you, the payments received from Kenya and Norway after the presentation result in its addition to the list of Member States paying their assessments in full for all categories. This brings the total to 41 Member States.

I would like to thank these Member States for this positive action in the last few days.
