BIOGRAPHIES

Dr. Khalid KOSER is Academic Dean and Head of the New Issues in Security Programme at the Geneva Centre for Security Policy (GCSP). He is a fellow at the Brookings Institution in Washington D.C., the Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies in Geneva, the Global Health Security Programme at Chatham House and several other institutions.

Dr. Koser was Deputy Director of the Brookings-Bern Project on Internal Displacement at the Brookings Institution and Senior Policy Analyst for the Global Commission on International Migration. Dr. Koser has published widely on international migration, asylum, refugees, and internal displacement and serves on the editorial board of several journals.



H.E. Mr. Saqr GHOBASH was appointed Minister of Labour of the United Arab Emirates in 2008. He has more than 35 years of public service, including as undersecretary of the Ministry of Interior and undersecretary of the Ministry of Information. Mr. Ghobash was also ambassador to the United States (2005 to 2008).

In addition to his ministerial portfolio, Mr. Ghobash holds numerous chairmanships, including of the board of trustees of the National Human Resource Development and Employment Authority, a federal agency that oversees and promotes the employment of UAE nationals.



H.E. Mr. Eduard GNESA is Special Ambassador for International Cooperation in Migration of the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC) since 2009. His public service career spans nearly 30 years, during which he has served, among others, as Director of the Federal Office for Migration and as Director of the Federal Office for Immigration, Integration and Emigration.

Ambassador Gnesa is Chair-in-Office of the fifth meeting of Global Forum on Migration and Development (GFMD), which is being hosted by the Government of Switzerland in 2011.



Mr. Anthony LAKE was appointed Executive Director of the United Nations Children’s Fund in May 2010. He has had a distinguished career with more than 45 years of public service, managing a full range of foreign policy, national security, humanitarian and development issues, including as U.S. National Security Advisor during the Clinton administration.



Prior to his appointment with UNICEF, he served as the United States President’s Special Envoy first in Ethiopia and Eritrea and later in Haiti. Mr. Lake was also Distinguished Professor in the Practice of Diplomacy at the Edmund A. Walsh School of Foreign Service at Georgetown University.

Ms. Thetis MANGAHAS is Senior Migration Specialist and Deputy Regional Director of Policy and Programmes at the ILO Regional Office for Asia and the Pacific in Bangkok, Thailand. She also oversees ILO’s migration and human trafficking programmes in the Asia-Pacific Region.



Prior to joining the ILO, Ms. Mangahas was the Deputy Administrator of the Philippine Overseas Employment Administration at the Department of Labour and Employment of the Government of the Philippines.

Dr. Rafael FERNÁNDEZ DE CASTRO is an expert on the bilateral relations between Mexico and the United States as well as on Mexican foreign policy. He is Founder and Chair of the Department of International Studies at the Instituto Tecnológico Autónomo de México. Until recently, he served as Presidential Advisor for International Affairs and Competitiveness.



Professor Fernández de Castro has published numerous articles and books and has taken part in many important forums, including the Binational Panel on Migration, which published the U.S.-Mexico Binational Study on Migration, and the World Economic Forum. He has lectured at many prestigious academic institutions, including Harvard University.
