In accordance with 64/568, Member States used the 65th GA session to move the Security Council reform process forward. In this regard, work was furthered on the negotiation text in order to create Rev3 – the third revision, addressing all five key issues of the reform.

This session has also seen several separate Member States' initiatives on Security Council reform. In this context, I offer Member States the opportunity to send me any documents outlining said initiatives and their results, so that I can, in the spirit of transparency, subsequently share them with the entire membership. This will allow all Member States to take these initiatives and their results into account as they prepare for the next session of the General Assembly.
