As you are aware, the Secretary General of the United Nations has established High-level Panel of Eminent Persons to advise him on the Post 2015 Development Agenda.

The Panel, which consists of 27 members from governments, civil society and the private sector, is co-chaired by the President of Indonesia, H.E. Dr. Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono, the President of Liberia, H.E. Ellen Johnson Sirleaf and the Prime Minister of the United Kingdom, the Rt. Hon. David Cameron.

The Panel held its third meeting on the 1st February in Monrovia. It focused on national building blocks for sustained prosperity,

In this regard, the Permanent Representatives of the Co-Chairs in New York kindly request you to convene an informal meeting of the General Assembly membership.

The purpose of the meeting is to brief Member States on the outcome of the Monrovia meeting of the High-level Panel and solicit their comments so as to promote an interactive dialogue on the issues at stake.

We would propose that the event be held on the 14th February 2013 to coincide with the visit to New York of the co-chair post 2015 Envoys.
