

The Political Affairs Section has a mandate to monitor the political, economic, social, humanitarian and military situation in Cote d'Ivoire and to make recommendations which would help in the search for a durable solution to the conflict and to ensure that the Linas-Marcoussis, Accra III and Pretoria Accords are being adhered to by the Ivorian Parties.

The Section advises the Special Representative of the Secretary-General of United Nations and provides him (her) with regular analysis of the political situation as well as the recommendations in dealing with certain questions. It maintains links with the governmental authorities, the political actors and the representatives of civil society groups in Ivory Coast.

The Section works in close consultation with several other partners and actors, national, sub-regional as well international, including the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS), the African Union and the International Organization of the French-speaking Countries.

The Section also works closely with the United Nations Office in West Africa, which is based in Dakar. Senegal.
