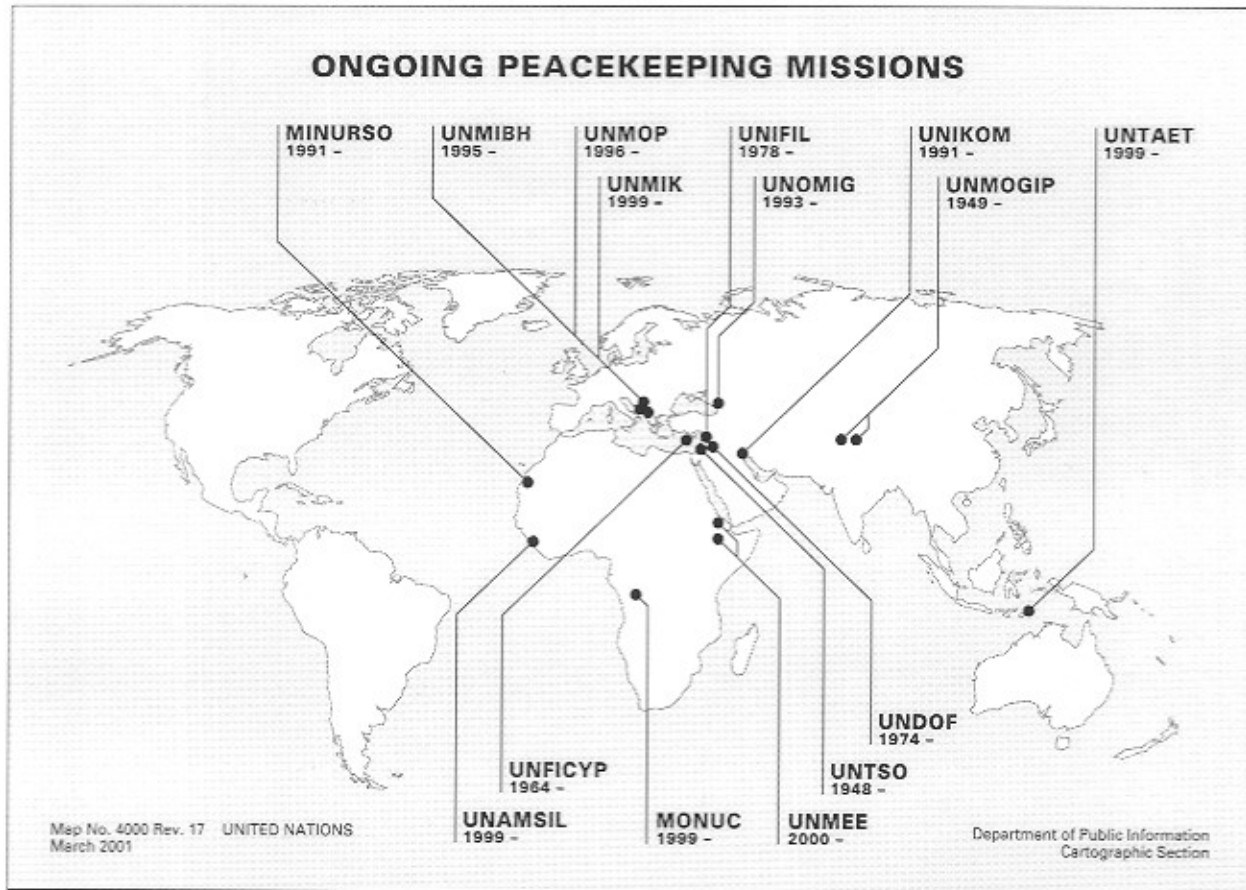

UNTSO and UNMOGIP are funded from the United Nations regular budget. Costs to the United Nations of the 13 other current operations are financed from their own separate accounts on the basis of legally binding assessments on all Member States. For these missions, budget figures are for one year (1 July 2001 to 30 June 2002) unless otherwise specified and include the prorated share of the support account for peacekeeping operations and the United Nations Logistics Base at Brindisi, Italy.
