Opening remarks by Ambassador Jose Javier De La Gasca, Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1540 (2004) at the third phase of the Peer Review for Brazil, Chile and Mexico on the Implementation of UN Security Council resolution 1540 (2004)

Excellencies, distinguished participants, ladies and gentlemen,

I also encourage you to share your experience with all member states, which will be posted through the 1540 Committee's website on its Shared Experience, Lessons Learned and Effective Practice page.

I thank again the Organization of American States for its contribution to States at the regional level in the full and effective implementation of resolution 1540 (2004).

Finally, I would like to note that in April of this year we will mark the 20th anniversary of resolution 1540 (2004). Since its adoption, Resolution 1540 has become a vital component of the global nonproliferation architecture.
