AFRICA

CAR: MINUSCA mandate

Resolution 2446 (2018) of 15 November 2018

Para 1. Decides to extend until 15 December 2018 the mandate of MINUSCA as set out in resolution 2387 (2017);

The mandate will expire on 15 December 2018.

CAR: French forces mandate in support of MINUSCA

Resolution 2387 (2017) of 15 November 2017

Para.65: Authorises French armed forces, within the provisions of their existing bilateral agreement with the CAR and the limits of their capacities and areas of deployment, at the request of the Secretary-General, to use all the means to provide operational support to elements of MINUSCA when under serious threat, from the date of adoption of this resolution, and requests France to ensure reporting to the Council on the implementation of this mandate and to coordinate its reporting with that of the Secretary-General referred to in paragraph 67 of this resolution;

Resolution 2446 (2018) of 15 November 2018

Para.1: Decides to extend until 15 December 2018 the mandate of MINUSCA as set out in resolution 2387 (2017);

The mandate will expire on 15 December 2018.

CAR: Sanctions: Panel of Experts reports

Resolution 2399 (2018) of 30 January 2018

Para.32 (c): Provide to the Security Council, after discussion with the Committee, a midterm report no later than 30 July 2018, and a final report by 31 December 2018, on the implementation of the measures imposed by paragraphs 54 and 55 of resolution [2127 \(2013\)](#) and paragraphs 30 and 32 of resolution [2134 \(2014\)](#) renewed by paragraphs 1, 2, 9 and 16 of this resolution;

The PoE final report is expected to be presented by 31 December 2018.

Central African region: SG reports on UNOCA, including on the situation in the Lake Chad region

Resolution 2349 (2017) of 31 March 2017

Para.34: Requests the Secretary-General to produce a written report within five months on the United Nations' assessment of the situation in the Lake Chad Basin Region as it relates to elements of this resolution, particularly regarding the progress made and remaining challenges, and possible measures for consideration, including with respect to achieving greater coherence of

efforts in the context of overlapping regional strategies, and thereafter to include these elements in regular reporting by UNOCA and UNOWAS.

S/PRST/2018/17 of 10 August 2018

Last para.: The Security Council requests the Secretary-General to provide a written report to it on the situation in Central Africa and UNOCA's activities, including on the situation in the Lake Chad region as requested in resolution [2349 \(2017\)](#), by 30 November 2018 and every six months thereafter.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 28 November 2018 (S/2018/1065) is before the Security Council.

DRC: SG reports on MONUSCO

Resolution 2409 (2018) of 27 March 2018

Para.59: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council every three months on the implementation of MONUSCO's mandate, including its Intervention Brigade, as set out in this resolution, including on: (...)

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in December 2018.

DRC: SG to conduct performance review of MONUSCO units, and report to the Council on satisfaction of requirements and related action

Resolution 2409 (2018) of 27 March 2018

Para.60: Requests the Secretary-General to conduct a comprehensive performance review of all MONUSCO units in accordance with the Operational Readiness Assurance and Performance Improvement Policy and the Secretary-General zero-tolerance policy on Sexual violence and abuse by September 2018 and further report to the Council every three months, as part of its regular reporting, on the percentage of MONUSCO contingents who have satisfied the requirements of the these reviews, the status of any remediation action to address contingents who have not satisfied requirements, and detailing plans to address contingents where remediation is not deemed appropriate, as certified by the Force Commander;

DRC: SG to update SC on progress towards 23 December 2018 elections, including implementation of election benchmarks and obstacles to implementation of the 31 December 2016 agreement

Resolution 2409 (2018) of 27 March 2018

Para.61: Requests the Secretary-General to update the Security Council in writing every 30 days on political and technical progress towards 23 December 2018 elections, including benchmarks laid out in paragraph 7 above and obstacles to the implementation of the 31 December 2016 agreement, when no regular reports are due;

The report of the Secretary-General dated 29 November 2018 (S/2018/1068) is before the Security Council.

DRC: Sanctions: Group of Experts mid-term report

Resolution 2424 (2018) of 29 June 2018

Para.4: Requests the Group of Experts to provide to the Council, after discussion with the Committee, a mid-term report no later than 30 December 2018, and a final report no later than 15 June 2019, as well as submit monthly updates to the Committee, except in the months where the mid-term and final reports are due;

The GoE mid-term report is expected to be presented no later than 30 December 2018.

Guinea-Bissau: SG to submit assessment of the Mission including options for possible reconfiguration of UN in-country presence and re-prioritization of tasks

Resolution 2404 (2018) of 28 February 2018

Para.28: Requests the Secretary-General to provide an oral update within 3 months on the political and security situation in Guinea Bissau and its preparation for elections, and submit to the Security Council regular reports every six months on the implementation of this resolution, and within 9 months submit the Secretary-General's assessment of the Mission including options for a possible reconfiguration of the United Nations presence in the country and re-prioritization of tasks, and to submit a report within six months, with a briefing to the Committee established pursuant to its resolution [2048 \(2012\)](#), on the progress made with regards to the stabilization of the country and restoration of constitutional order and recommendations on the continuation of the sanctions regime in the post-election environment, in line with paragraph 12 of resolution [2048 \(2012\)](#);

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in December 2018.

Mali: SG reports on MINUSMA on the implementation of resolution 2423 (2018)

Resolution 2423 (2018) of 28 June 2018

Para.70: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council every three months after the adoption of this resolution on the implementation of this resolution, focusing:

(i) on the progress in the implementation of the Agreement and on MINUSMA's efforts to support it,

(ii) on progress in the implementation of the measures taken to improve MINUSMA's performance and effectiveness to implement its mandate, as outlined in paragraphs 55 to 60 above, including measures to enhance the safety and security of MINUSMA's personnel and to implement a comprehensive approach to protection of civilians,

(iii) on coordination, exchange of information and, when applicable, mutual operational and logistical support, between MINUSMA, the MDSF, the FCG5S, the French Forces and the European Union missions in Mali, as outlined in paragraph 41 above;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in December 2018.

Mali: Report by France on implementation of mandate to support MINUSMA

Resolution 2423 (2018) of 28 June 2018

Para.53: Authorizes French forces, within the limits of their capacities and areas of deployment, to use all necessary means until the end of MINUSMA's mandate as authorized in this resolution, to intervene in support of elements of MINUSMA when under imminent and serious threat upon request of the Secretary-General, and requests France to report to the Council on the implementation of this mandate in Mali and to coordinate its reporting with the reporting by the Secretary-General referred to in paragraph 70 below;

Somalia: UNSOM: SG reports on the implementation of resolution 2408 (2018)

Resolution 2408 (2018) of 27 March 2018

Para.28: Requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council regularly informed on the implementation of this resolution, identify and report on progress towards achieving key political benchmarks, including through oral updates and no fewer than three written reports, with the first written report by 1 May 2018 and every 120 days thereafter;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in December 2018.

Somalia: AMISOM: SG reports on the implementation of resolution 2431 (2018)

Resolution 2431 (2018) of 30 July 2018

Para.55: Requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council regularly informed on the implementation of this resolution in his regular reports requested in paragraph 28 of resolution 2408 (2018);

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in December 2018.

South Sudan: SG report on implementation of the UNMISS mandate and obstructions

Resolution 2406 (2018) of 15 March 2018

Para.33: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on implementation of the UNMISS mandate and the obstructions UNMISS encounters in doing so in a same comprehensive written report to be submitted within 90 days of the date of adoption of this resolution, every 90 days thereafter, and underscores that such reporting should include: (...)

South Sudan: Sanctions: Panel of Experts interim report

Resolution 2428 (2018) of 13 July 2018

Para.19 (e): Provide to the Council, after discussion with the Committee, an interim report by 1 December 2018, a final report by 1 May 2019, and except in the months when these reports are due, updates each month;

The PoE interim report dated 26 November 2018 (S/2018/1049) is before the Security Council.

Sudan: ICC Prosecutor briefing

Resolution 1593 (2005) of 31 March 2005

Para.8: Invites the Prosecutor to address the Council within three months of the date of adoption of this resolution and every six months thereafter on actions taken pursuant to this resolution.

The Prosecutor is expected to brief in December 2018.

UNOWAS: SG reports to SC

PSC letter of 29 December 2016 (S/2016/1129)

Second para: The members of the Security Council concur with the recommendation contained in your second report on UNOWAS (S/2016/1072) to extend its mandate, as set forth in the annex to this letter, for a further period of three years, from 1 January 2017 to 31 December 2019. The members of the Council request that you report to the Council every six months on the fulfilment by UNOWAS of its mandate.

Colombia: SG to report on Verification Mission

Resolution 2435 (2018) of 13 September 2018

Para.1: Decides to extend, to 25 September 2019, the mandate of the Verification Mission and reporting requirements in accordance with its resolutions 2366 and [2377 \(2017\)](#), headed by a Special Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in December 2018.

Haiti: MINUJUSTH: SG report on implementation of resolution 2410 (2018)

Resolution 2410 (2018) of 10 April 2018

Para.4: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the implementation of this resolution, including any instances of mandate implementation failures and measures taken to address these, in reports every 90 days starting from 1 June 2018;

The report of the Secretary-General dated 28 November 2018 (S/2018/1059) is before the Security Council.

ASIA/MIDDLE EAST

Afghanistan: SG reports on UNAMA

Resolution 2405 (2018) of 8 March 2018

Para.44: Requests that the Secretary-General reports to the Council every three months on developments in Afghanistan, and to include in his reports an evaluation of progress made against the benchmarks for measuring and tracking progress in the implementation of UNAMA's mandate, including at the subnational level, and priorities as set out in this resolution;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in December 2018.

Iraq: Special Adviser to complete reports on the Investigative Team's activities and present them to the SC

Resolution 2379 (2017) of 21 September 2017

Para.15: Requests the Special Adviser to complete the first report of the Team's activities, within 90 days of the date on which it commences its activities, as notified by the Secretary-General, and to complete subsequent reports every 180 days thereafter, and requests the Special Adviser to present these reports to the Security Council;

SG letter of 17 August 2018 (S/2018/773)

Penultimate para.: In this regard, and following the mission of the Special Adviser to Iraq, I have the honour to notify the Security Council that the Investigative Team will begin its work on 20 August 2018.

Middle East: The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question

Resolution 1322 (2000) of 7 October 2000

Para.7: Invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian Question: SG to report to the Council on the implementation of resolution 2334 (2016)

Resolution 2334 (2016) of 23 December 2016

Para.12: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council every three months on the implementation of the provisions of the present resolution;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in December 2018.

Middle East (Lebanon/UNIFIL): SG to provide recommendations regarding the management of UNIFIL civilian resources

Resolution 2433 (2018) of 30 August 2018

Para.12: Stresses the need to improve the management of UNIFIL civilian resources, including through fostering enhanced cooperation with the Office of the United Nations Special Coordinator for Lebanon (UNSCOL), with the goal of improving the effectiveness and efficiency of the missions, and requests that the Secretary-General provide recommendations on the matter by 31 December 2018;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be provided by 31 December 2018.

Middle East (Syria): OPCW DG to report to SC (through SG) on impl. of resolution 2118 (2013)

Resolution 2118 (2013) of 27 September 2013

Para.12: Decides to review on a regular basis the implementation in the Syrian Arab Republic of the decision of the OPCW Executive Council of 27 September 2013 and this resolution, and requests the Director-General of the OPCW to report to the Security Council, through the Secretary-General, who shall include relevant information on United Nations activities related to the implementation of this resolution, within 30 days and every month thereafter, and requests further the Director-General of the OPCW and the Secretary-General to report in a coordinated manner, as needed, to the Security Council, non-compliance with this resolution or the OPCW Executive Council decision of 27 September 2013.

The report is expected to be presented in December 2018.

Middle East (Syria): SG to report on implementation of resolutions 2139 (2014), 2165 (2014), 2191 (2014), 2258 (2015), 2332 (2016) and 2393 (2017)

Resolution 2139 (2014) of 22 February 2014

Para.17: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the implementation of this resolution by all parties in Syria, in particular paragraphs 2 through 12, in 30 days of its adoption and every 30 days thereafter, and upon receipt of the Secretary-General's report, expresses its intent to take further steps in the case of non-compliance with this resolution;

Resolution 2393 (2017) of 19 December 2017

Para.6: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the implementation of this resolution, and on compliance by all relevant parties in Syria, within the framework of its reporting on resolutions 2139 (2014), 2165 (2014), 2191 (2014), 2258 (2015) and 2332 (2016) and further requests the Secretary-General to include in his monthly reports overall trends in UN cross-line and cross-border humanitarian access, and more detailed information on the humanitarian assistance delivered through UN humanitarian cross-border operations as authorized by UNSCR 2165 (2014), including on the number of beneficiaries, locations of aid deliveries at district-level, and the volume and nature of items delivered;

Middle East (Syria): SG to report to SC on the implementation of resolution 2401 (2018) and compliance by parties

Resolution 2401 (2018) of 24 February 2018

Para.12: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the implementation of this resolution, and on compliance by all relevant parties in Syria, within 15 days of adoption of this resolution and thereafter within the framework of its reporting on resolutions 2139 (2014), 2165 (2014), 2191 (2014), 2258 (2015), 2332 (2016) and 2393 (2017);

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in December 2018.

Middle East (Syria): SG report on the implementation of resolution 2268 (2016)

Resolution 2268 (2016) of 26 February 2016

Para.10: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the implementation of this resolution, including by drawing on information provided by the ISSG ceasefire taskforce, and on resolution 2254 (2015), within 15 days of the adoption of this resolution and every 30 days thereafter;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in December 2018.

Middle East (UNDOF): UNDOF mandate

Resolution 2426 (2018) of 29 June 2018

Para.12: Decides to renew the mandate of UNDOF for a period of six months, that is, until 31 December 2018, and requests the Secretary-General to ensure that UNDOF has the required capacity and resources to fulfil the mandate in a safe and secure way;

The mandate will expire on 31 December 2018.

Middle East (UNDOF): SG reports on developments in the situation and measures taken to implement resolution 338 (1973)

Resolution 2426 (2018) of 29 June 2018

Para.13: Requests the Secretary-General to report every 90 days on developments in the situation and the measures taken to implement resolution 338 (1973).

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in December 2018.

Non-proliferation (Iran): Joint Commission reports

Resolution 2231 (2015) of 20 July 2015

JCPOA Annex IV – Joint Commission para. 6.10.: The Joint Commission will report to the United Nations Security Council at least every 6 months on the status of the Procurement Working Group's decisions and on any implementation issues.

Facilitator's proposal as agreed on 17 March 2017

The Joint Commission is expected to report in December 2018.

Non-proliferation (Iran): Facilitator to brief the other members of the SC

Note by the PSC of 16 January 2016

Para.3: To facilitate its work under resolution 2231 (2015), the Security Council shall select on an annual basis one member to serve as its facilitator for the functions specified in the present note. The facilitator shall brief the other members of the Council on its work and the implementation of the resolution every six months, in parallel with the report submitted by the Secretary-General in accordance with paragraph 7 below.

Facilitator's proposal as agreed on 17 March 2017

The facilitator is expected to brief in December 2018.

Non-proliferation (Iran): SG reports on the implementation of resolution 2231 (2015)

Note by the PSC of 16 January 2016

Para.7: The Security Council requests that the Secretary-General report to the Security Council every six months on the implementation of resolution 2231 (2015). Prior to the public release of that report, the Security Council shall meet informally, normally at the expert level, to review the findings and recommendations contained in the report.

Facilitator's proposal as agreed on 17 March 2017

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in December 2018.

Residual Mechanism: Annual report

Resolution 1966 (2010) of 22 December 2010

Para.16: Requests the President of the Mechanism to submit an annual report to the Security Council and to the General Assembly, and the President and the Prosecutor of the Mechanism to submit six-monthly reports to the Security Council on the progress of the work of the Mechanism;

The letter from the IRMCT President dated 1 August 2018 (S/2018/569) is before the Security Council.

Residual mechanism: Progress reports

Resolution 1966 (2010) of 22 December 2010

Para. 16: Requests the President of the Mechanism to submit an annual report to the Security Council and to the General Assembly, and the President and the Prosecutor of the Mechanism to submit six-monthly reports to the Security Council on the progress of the work of the Mechanism;

The progress report dated 19 November 2018 (S/2018/1033) is before the Security Council.

Maintenance of international peace & security: SG report on trafficking in persons in armed conflict

Resolution 2388 (2017) of 21 November 2017

Para.34: Requests the Secretary-General to follow-up on the implementation of this resolution and report back to the Security Council on progress made within 12 months;

The report of the Secretary-General dated 21 November 2018 (S/2018/1042) is before the Security Council.

PBC Organizational Committee: election of two E-10 members

Resolution 1645 (2005) of 20 December 2005

Para.6: Decides that members of the Organizational Committee shall serve for renewable terms of two years, as applicable.

Resolution 1646 (2005) of 20 December 2005

Para.1: Decides pursuant to paragraph 4 (a) of resolution 1645 (2005) that the permanent members listed in article 23 (1) of the Charter shall be members of the Organizational Committee of the Peacebuilding Commission and that, in addition, the Council shall select annually two of its elected members to participate in the Organizational Committee.

The Security Council is expected to announce by January 2019 the two members elected to serve on the PBC Organizational Committee.

Subsidiary bodies: Elected Chairs and Vice-Chairs of subsidiary bodies

Note by the PSC of 2 January 2018 (S/2018/2)

Para.1: Pursuant to paragraph 4 (b) of the note by the President of the Security Council dated 30 October 1998 (S/1998/1016) and paragraphs 111 to 114 of the note by the President of the Council dated 30 August 2017 (S/2017/507), and after consultations among the members of the Council, it was agreed to elect the Chairs and Vice-Chairs of subsidiary bodies for the period ending 31 December 2018 as follows:

The mandate of the current elected chairs and vice-chairs of subsidiary bodies will end on 31 December 2018.

United Nations peacekeeping operations: Police Commissioners: SG report on policing Resolution 2382 (2017) on 6 November 2017

Para.16: Requests the Secretary-General to provide a report by the end of 2018, including on:

- (a) Implications for the delivery of policing mandates stemming from any changes to the United Nations Secretariat's Peace and Security Architecture;
- (b) Strengthening United Nations Policing's operational and policy coherence within the United Nations system;
- (c) Improving United Nations capability, accountability and transparency on United Nations Policing;
- (d) Planning for strategic police generation gaps and key skill sets;
- (e) Ensuring coherence of relevant United Nations Policing initiatives, in order to improve mission transitions and timely exits;
- (f) Strengthening partnerships between the United Nations and international, regional and subregional organizations in accordance with Chapter VIII of the United Nations Charter, in the areas of policing.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in December 2018.
