1. The situation concerning Western Sahara

During the period under review, the Security Council held four meetings, including two private/closed meetings, ¹ and adopted two resolutions in connection with the situation concerning Western Sahara. By resolutions <u>2152 (2014)</u> and <u>2218 (2015)</u>, respectively, the Council extended the mandate of the United Nations Mission for the Referendum in Western Sahara (MINURSO)² for periods of one year.
