Security Council Practices and Charter Research Branch**20. Items relating to the situation in the former Yugoslavia****B. Security Council resolutions 1160 (1998), 1199 (1998), 1203 (1998), 1239 (1999) and 1244 (1999)**

During the period under review, the Security Council held eight meetings in connection with the item entitled “Security Council resolutions 1160 (1998), 1199 (1998), 1203 (1998), 1239 (1999) and 1244 (1999).” At these meetings, the Council discussed the political developments in Kosovo, with a focus on the implementation of the agreement on the principles governing the normalization of relations between Pristina and Belgrade, in particular the establishment of the association of Serb-majority municipalities. The Council also discussed the return of internally displaced persons, the promotion of human rights, the protection of cultural heritage sites, and the prevention of recruitment of foreign fighters to join the conflicts in Syria and Iraq.

The Council further focused on the work of the United Nations Interim Administration Mission in Kosovo (UNMIK),¹ as well as the European Rule of Law Mission in Kosovo (EULEX), the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE) and the Kosovo Force (KFOR). In 2015, the Council considered the creation of a special court for war crimes by the authority in Pristina and the bid of Kosovo for membership of the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).
