

The New Human Rights Dialogue Series Presents:

## The Highest Common Denominator: Human Rights in Peacemaking

The panel discussion is the 6<sup>th</sup> installment of the *New Human Rights Dialogue Series*, a collaborative initiative of the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights, Member States, the NGO Committee on Human Rights, and the Department of Public Information. The Series is a 12-part, monthly series of discussions at United Nations Headquarters, leading up to the celebration on 10 December 2008 of the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

This year also marks the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of UN Peacekeeping. As part of these commemorations, the 6<sup>th</sup> installment will examine the integration of human rights into peace negotiations and peace agreements. The panel is titled "*The Highest Common Denominator: Human Rights in Peacemaking*".

Panelists include Jamal Benomar, UN Rule of Law Unit; Peggy Hicks, Human Rights Watch; H.E. Milos Prica, Permanent Mission of Bosnia and Herzegovina; H.E. Zahir Tanin, Permanent Mission of Afghanistan; Paul van Zyl, International Center for Transitional Justice; and a representative from the UN Department of Political Affairs.

The Panelists will address key questions in integrating human rights into peacemaking, such as:

- Is there a trade-off between peace and human rights?
- What are the incentives proposed by peacemakers for inclusion of human rights into peace negotiations and committing local protagonists to abide by them?
- What are the temporal and substantive scopes of permissible amnesties? How to deal with the individual criminal responsibility of conflict protagonists?
- What guides the choice between different transitional justice mechanisms?
- What are the mechanisms at the national and international level to monitor the implementation of human rights provisions in peace accords and are they effective?
- Are the measures identified in the 2004 Report of the UN High-level Panel on Threats, Challenges and Change for improving the interaction between international and local peacemakers sufficient? What are the missing elements?
- How are peacemakers implementing SC Resolution 1325?

The panel will take place on 29 May 2008 at the UN Headquarters, Conference room 2, from 3:00 pm to 6:00 pm. It will be broadcast via the United Nations Web cast.
